Kingdom Education

Principle #6: The education of children and youth must not hinder the spiritual and moral development of the next generation.

“But if anyone causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him to have a large millstone hung around his neck and to be drowned in the depths of the sea.” Matthew 18:6

“Then little children were brought to Jesus for him to place his hands on them and pray for them. But the disciples rebuked those who brought them. Jesus said, ‘Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.’” Matthew 19:13-14

“People were bringing little children to Jesus to have him touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, ‘Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it.’ And he took the children in his arms, put his hands on them and blessed them.” Mark 10:13-16

“When the disciples tried to keep children from getting too close to Jesus, He rebuked them very firmly. It was in this context that Jesus made statements about the seriousness of offending a young person as noted in the passages above. Sometimes we think of offending children only in means of physical abuse, but anything that hinders their moral and spiritual development is the epitome of child abuse. The big question we must answer concerning the education of our children and youth is simply – Are our children being taught anything that will draw them away from Jesus? ” (*Kingdom Education*, Glen Schultz)
