Kingdom Education

Principle #7: The education of children and youth, if and when delegated to others by parents, must be done by teachers chosen with utmost care to ensure that they all follow these principles.

“But select capable men from all the people – men who fear God, trustworthy men who hate dishonest gain – and appoint them as officials over thousands, hundreds, fifties and tens. “ Exodus 18:21

“The task of raising children is awesome. It is becoming more demanding with each passing day. Does this person fear God, love truth, and hate covetousness? 2. What can you do to ensure that such people are the only ones that you allow to help you educate your children?
