AP Exam

Christian Academy offers a wide variety of 19 AP courses. Each year students taking AP classes participate in an AP Exam that compares our students with their peers in the state of Kentucky as well as across the globe.

In 2018, 204 AP students at Christian Academy of Louisville took the exam with 73% or 149 scoring a 3 or higher. In the state of Kentucky, only 52% of AP students who took the exam scored a 3 or higher, and 59% of global AP students attained this score.

29 students were recognized as AP Scholars (passing at least 3 AP exams). 15 students were recognized as AP Scholars with Honors (passing 4 AP exams) 18 as AP Scholars with Distinction (passing 6 AP exams), and 4 as National AP Scholars (scores of atleast 4 on all exams taken and 4 or higher on 8 or more exams).

College Attendance

Of the Class of 2018, 95% attend a four-year college and 4% attend a two-year college. 53% attend an in-state, public, four-year college.

Academic Distinction

The Class of 2018 had 3 National Merit Finalists and 2 National Merit Commended students. 4 students were appointed as Governor's Scholars and 5 students were accepted to the Governor's School for the Arts. We have also had 7 appointments to military academies in the last 6 years.

Graduation Requirements

All students receive an excellent, traditional education in a challenging, academic environment. The Standard Program provides a solid foundation which prepares all students for continuing their education beyond high school. The College Preparatory Program is much more demanding and includes foreign language coursework required by major colleges and universities. The Honors Program offers a rigorous curriculum with the opportunity to earn college credit. Sixty hours of community service must be completed by all students for graduation.

22 Credits are required for all three diplomas:

Bible (4 credits) English (4 credits) Science (3 credits) Math (3 credits) Social Studies (3 credits)

Fine Arts (1 credit) Computer,
Physical Education &
Health (1/2 credit each)
Electives (3 credits)

Additionally, two credits of Foreign Language are required for the Honors and College Preparatory Program diplomas. The Honors Program requires 24 credits and a 3.5 GPA. The College Preparatory Program requires 24 credits and a 3.0 GPA.

Diploma with Fine Arts Designation

Graduates of the School of the Arts will also receive a diploma with a Fine Arts Designation reflecting their successful completion of the program requirements. To receive the Fine Arts Designation students must complete all required coursework and maintain a 3.0 GPA in all classes specific to their fine arts track.

School of Biomedical Science Designation

CAL is a certified Project Lead the Way school offering a world-class biomedical curriculum that enables students to obtain the skills needed to succeed in the global economy. Students can earn the School of Biomedical Science Designation by completing the required course work and maintain a 3.25 GPA in their science course work.

Highlights

Christian Academy students have the opportunity to participate in daily Bible instruction, weekly Chapel times, mission trips and accelerated visual and musical performing arts groups.
