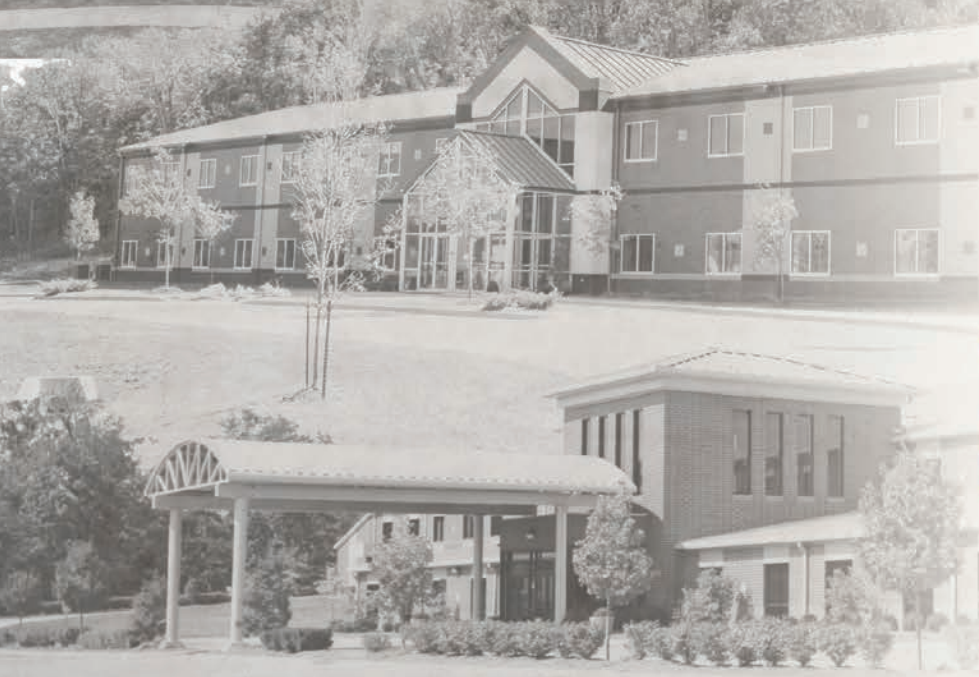

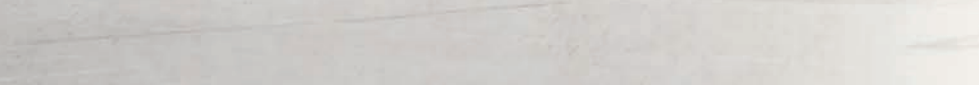

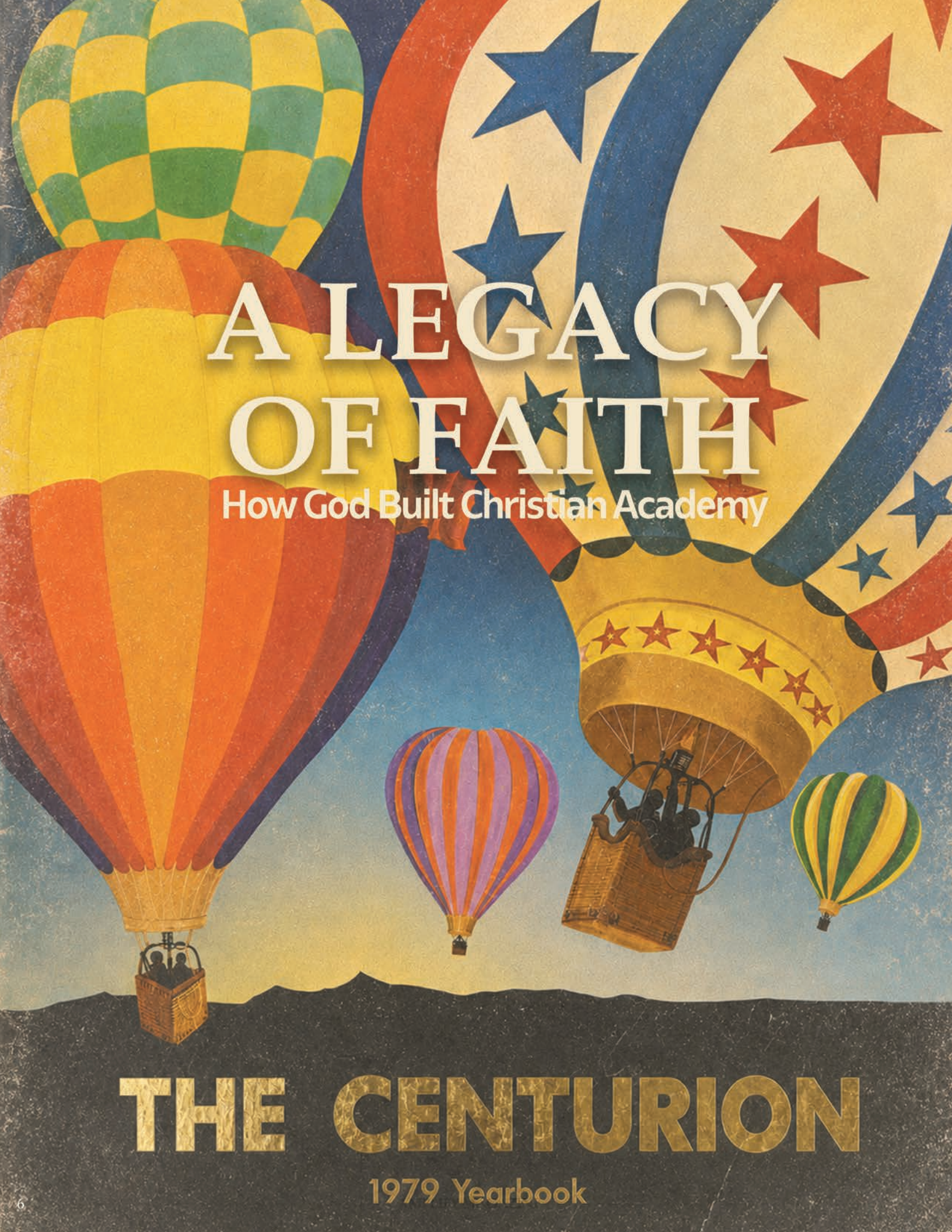

A LEGACY OF FAITH

How God Built Christian Academy

THE CENTURION

“What followed was a journey marked by faith, sacrifice and God’s unmistakable provision.”

By all appearances, Christian Academy should never have become what it is today.

There was no master plan for a multi-campus school system serving thousands of students. There was no roadmap for building campuses, expanding programs or impacting generations of families. There was simply a group of believers who shared a common conviction: children deserved an education grounded in God’s truth.

What followed was a journey marked by faith, sacrifice and God’s unmistakable provision.

Humble Beginnings

The story began in 1974 when some members at South Louisville Christian Church gathered for a Sunday school meeting and began discussing the possibility of starting a Christian school. Soon, representatives from several local Christian churches joined the conversation, meeting at Shively Christian Church to explore what such a school might look like.

Two years later, on September 1, 1976, Christian Academy of Louisville opened its doors with approximately 120 students in grades one through six. The school operated from two church locations, South Louisville Christian Church and Clifton Christian Church.

Those early years were not easy.

Classrooms were borrowed spaces that served as Sunday school rooms on weekends. Resources were limited. School leaders searched wherever they could for desks, bookcases, blackboards and textbooks. They collected used materials from public school depositories and even salvaged equipment from abandoned school buildings. Yet through every challenge, God continued to provide. Enrollment grew and so did the vision.

Stepping Forward in Faith

By 1977, Christian Academy had expanded to include a middle school campus at Southeast Christian Church, doubling enrollment to approximately 240 students. Growth brought new opportunities but it also created logistical challenges. Operating multiple campuses across the city proved difficult and school leaders recognized the need to consolidate.

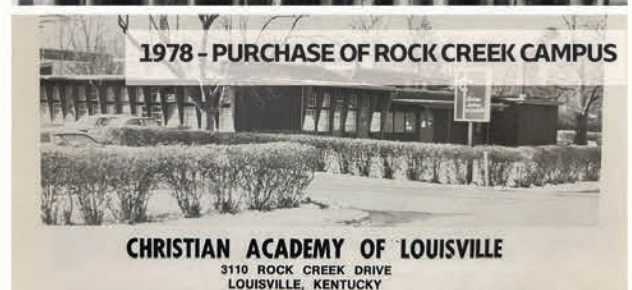
In August 1978, Christian Academy purchased the former Kentucky Country Day property on Rock Creek Drive. With an enrollment of 336 students, the school opened its own campus and continued adding grade levels each year. In the spring of 1982, Christian Academy celebrated its first graduating class.

The excitement was tremendous but growth continued at a pace few could have anticipated.

Classrooms filled. Closets became learning spaces. Once again, school leaders faced a difficult question: Would they limit enrollment or would they trust God to make a way forward?

When God Opens Doors

As the need for expansion became clear, the Board was faced with a seemingly impossible challenge.

There was no land.

There was no money.

There appeared to be no practical path forward.

Yet as board members prayed and sought God's direction, a shared conviction emerged. Rather than settling for what seemed safe, they believed God was calling them to take a larger step of faith.

What happened next could only be described as God's provision.

A beautiful piece of property became available in exactly the right location. Part of the land was donated. Financing was secured through an unprecedented loan. Against all odds, Christian Academy's English Station Campus became a reality.

Initially, leaders planned to sell the Rock Creek Campus. Instead, applications continued to pour in. The decision was made to keep Rock Creek open, move elementary, middle, and high school students to the new English Station Campus, establish a new elementary school at Rock Creek and launch the school's first preschool program, all within a single summer.

"It was a miracle what the Lord has done," reflected one of the school's early leaders.

More Than a Name

Throughout every season of growth, Christian Academy's mission remained unchanged.

The founders understood that success would never be measured solely by enrollment numbers, facilities or programs. The true measure of success would be faithfulness to Christ.

"We have to keep Christian in our name and we have to keep Christian in what we do," one leader explained.

That commitment continues today.

Christian Academy now serves 3,200 students, more than 500 employees and represents 400 churches across Kentucky and Indiana. Across every campus, students are challenged academically, encouraged spiritually and equipped to view the world through a biblical lens. Faculty and staff model Christian character, not only through what they teach but through how they live.

A Light for the Future

As Christian Academy looks ahead, the story remains unfinished.

The same God who provided classrooms, campuses, resources and opportunities continues to guide the school's future. The mission remains as clear today as it was in 1976: to help students know Christ, discover His purpose for their lives and make an impact on the world around them.

The founders could never have imagined all that God would accomplish through their faithfulness.

Yet perhaps the greatest legacy is not found in buildings, enrollment numbers or milestones. It is found in generations of graduates who are serving as leaders, professionals, parents, missionaries and followers of Christ around the world.

Christian Academy was never just about opening a school.

It was, and continues to be, about shining the light of Christ for generations to come.

Let the Children Come to Me

(Jesus Christ)

In the 1970s, K-12 schools in America's southern states often appeared to be faced with only two choices: racially integrated public schools or single-race private schools.

But in 1976, a Christian school was born in Louisville, Kentucky with a different aspiration. Christian Academy of Louisville sought to operate under God's authority and to promote the God-authored equality of all people.

The school's philosophical foundation was publicized in a July 3, 1976, Courier-Journal article, where Christian Academy of Louisville Director Reverend Terry Allshouse stated that the school "will be open to Blacks and Whites." He said, "We've had some inquiries from Black people and we're more than eager to accept them." He also emphasized that Christian Academy was "not an escape from desegregation. What we're really trying to do is start a school with a quality education and in a Christian environment."

This neighborly vision for Christian Academy of Louisville was further articulated in a September 20, 1976, Courier-Journal article. James E. Farmer, former Deputy Superintendent of the Jefferson County School System, became Christian Academy of Louisville's first-ever Superintendent. He said he accepted the position "on the condition that the school would not become a haven for white flight, whites trying to avoid the desegregation of the public schools."

Today, Christian Academy of Louisville in Louisville, Kentucky and Christian Academy of Indiana in New Albany, Indiana collectively make up Christian Academy School System. The system includes 9 schools, 3,200 students, more than 500 employees and families representing 400 different local churches.

During the 2020s, an especially contentious decade in American history, Christian Academy School System enrolled significantly more minority students than any other private or Christian school in Jefferson County, Kentucky and Floyd County, Indiana.

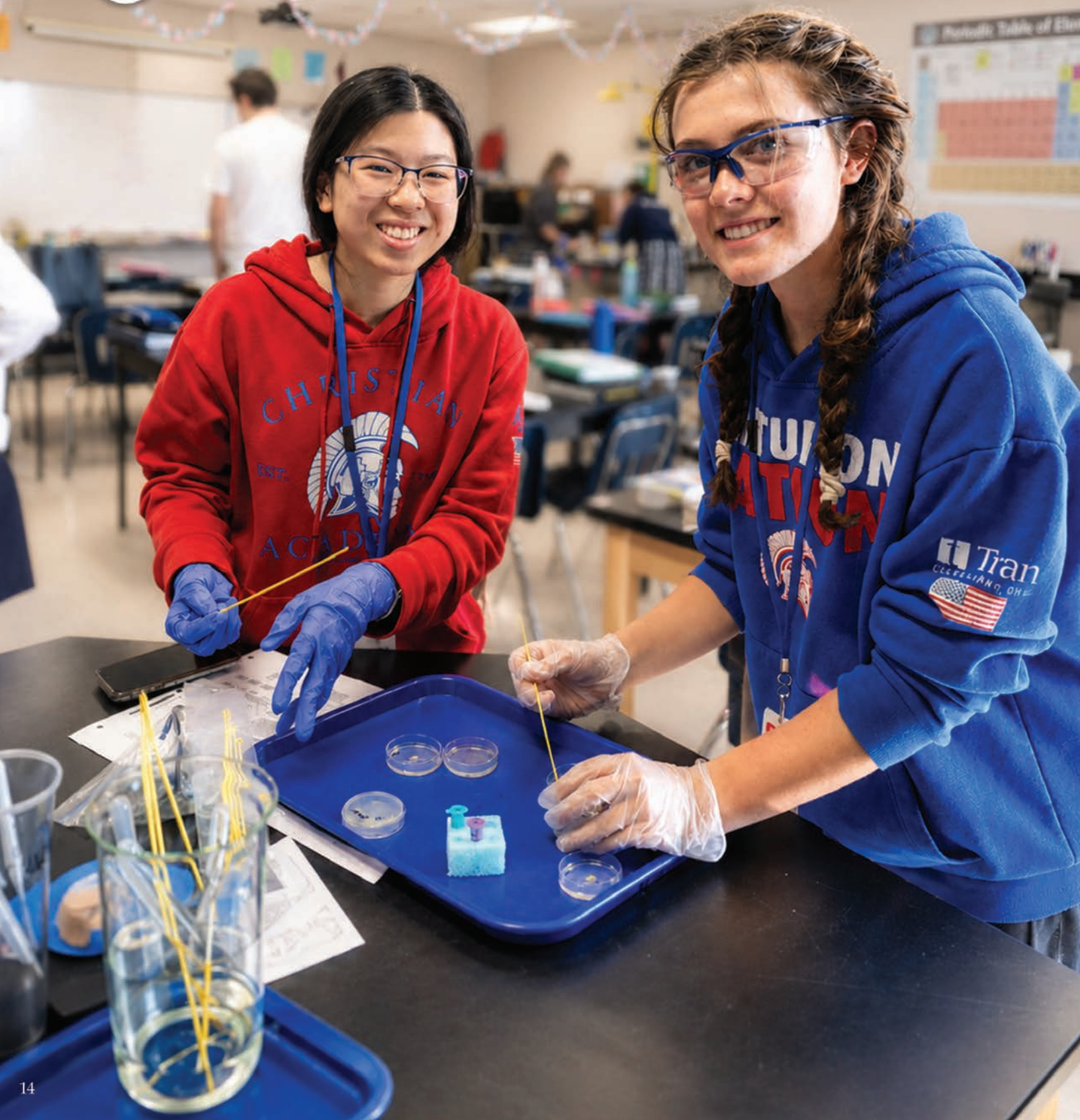

Celebrating 10 Years of the School of Biomedical Science

This year, Christian Academy of Louisville proudly celebrates the 10th anniversary of the School of Biomedical Science—a decade of preparing students to pursue excellence in science while remaining firmly rooted in their faith.

What began in 2014 with just 12 students enrolled in a single Project Lead the Way Biomedical Science course has grown into one of Christian Academy's signature Diploma of Distinction pathways. Today, 197 students are enrolled in biomedical science courses and since the program's inception, 481 students have earned their white coats while more than 167 graduates have received a Diploma of Distinction in Biomedical Science.

While these milestones are certainly worth celebrating, the true impact of the School of Biomedical Science reaches far beyond awards and enrollment numbers.

Built on the conviction that science is not separate from faith, the program challenges students to view medicine not simply as a career path but as a calling to serve others for God's glory. Every lesson reinforces the truth that scientific discovery reveals the creativity and order of our Creator, while every patient represents a person made in the image of God.

Using curriculum from Project Lead the Way—the nation's premier provider of STEM education—students engage in rigorous, hands-on learning that mirrors real-world medical practice. Throughout the four-year pathway, they investigate crime scenes, build and study human body systems, explore genetics and biomedical innovation, and wrestle with many of the same ethical questions facing today's healthcare professionals.

By graduation, students have earned college credit, developed professional portfolios and completed internships or shadowing experiences in hospitals and medical clinics. These opportunities allow them to discover where their passions, gifts and God-given calling intersect while preparing them for success in college and future careers in medicine, nursing, research, physical therapy and many other healthcare professions.

What makes Christian Academy's School of Biomedical Science truly unique, however, is its intentional integration of faith into every aspect of learning.

Throughout the school year, Christian physicians, nurses and healthcare professionals visit classrooms to share both their medical expertise and their personal testimonies.

Students hear firsthand what it looks like to trust Christ while serving patients in operating rooms, emergency departments, clinics and research laboratories. They witness professionals whose faith shapes not only what they do but how they care for others with compassion, humility and excellence.

A defining experience within the pathway is participation in the annual Global Missions Health Conference, where students learn from medical missionaries serving around the world. As they hear stories from healthcare providers on the front lines of ministry, students begin to see medicine as an opportunity to bring both physical healing and the hope of the Gospel to people across the globe.

The School of Biomedical Science is one of four Diplomas of Distinction pathways offered at Christian Academy, alongside School of Engineering, School of the Arts and School of Spiritual Formation. Together, these programs provide rigorous academics and meaningful, hands-on experiences that help students discover and develop the unique gifts God has given them. Whether a student is called to healthcare, engineering, the arts or ministry, Christian Academy offers opportunities to prepare them academically, professionally and spiritually.

As we celebrate this milestone anniversary, we are grateful for God's faithfulness, the vision of the educators who launched the program, the generosity of donors and community partners, and the dedicated teachers who continue to disciple students each day. Their investment extends far beyond the classroom as they prepare young men and women to serve Christ through their professions.

The world needs healthcare professionals who are highly skilled, deeply compassionate and firmly grounded in God's truth. Our prayer is that every graduate of the School of Biomedical Science will carry the love of Christ into hospitals, clinics, laboratories and communities around the world, bringing healing to both body and soul while honoring the Great Physician in all they do.

For families exploring Christian Academy of Louisville, the School of Biomedical Science is just one example of how we intentionally equip students to grow in wisdom, stature and in favor with God and men. We are grateful for the opportunity to partner with families as we prepare the next generation to discover God's calling and faithfully impact the world for His glory.



SCHOOLS OF DISTINCTION

In addition to 19 AP courses and 24 honors courses, Christian Academy of Louisville's English Station High School offers four programs of distinction. The School of the Arts, School of Biomedical Science, School of Spiritual Formation and School of Engineering offer a rigorous curriculum with robust hands-on experiences that equip students for professional and/or collegiate preparation in these areas of study.

SCHOOL OF THE ARTS

Through Christian Academy's growing and award-winning fine arts programs, students have numerous opportunities to develop their gifts through the Christian Academy School of the Arts. In addition to the Honors, College Prep and Standard Diploma offerings, graduates of the School of the Arts will also receive a diploma with a special School of the Arts designation reflecting their successful completion of the program requirements.

SCHOOL OF BIOMEDICAL SCIENCE

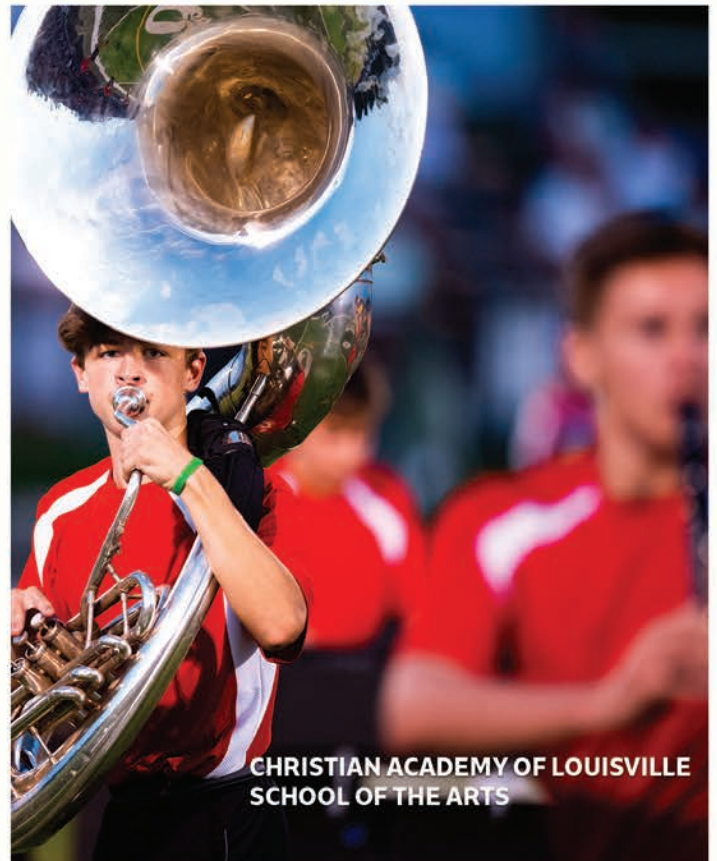
Based on course offerings, student involvement and proficiency as well as the integration of science within the school, Christian Academy was designated as a "Distinguished High School" by Project Lead the Way (the nation's premier provider of STEM curriculum). Students wishing to take a concentration of science courses in the School of Biomedical Science will earn a diploma of distinction reflecting their enrollment in the SBS. In addition to specific coursework, this concentration requires an annual paper and portfolio including insights and reflections on their year, CPR Certification, participation in the Global Missions Health Conference, health service requirements and HOSA membership.

SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING

Courses in the School of Engineering are designed to challenge and expand a student's engineering knowledge, analytical abilities and critical thinking skills in bringing God-driven service to others. Students enrolled in the program will enjoy teamwork, problem-solving activities and learning experiences that will serve students well in life as well as in key professions. Such occupations may include careers in biomedical engineering, civil engineering, mechanical engineering, architectural design, electrical engineering, computer science and many others.

SCHOOL OF SPIRITUAL FORMATION

This organic, three-year pathway fully unites with the mission statement of Christian Academy to develop students with a heart for God who grow as Jesus did in wisdom, stature and in favor with God and men. Some features include individual mentoring, small class size, learning environment, retreats, guest speakers, an internship, college credit, leadership development, Christian service experience and an individual student portfolio. Students who successfully fulfill all of the pathway obligations will receive a Christian Academy diploma of distinction.

Preparing Students for the Marketplace

Christian Academy of Indiana is equipping students with more than classroom knowledge—it's preparing them to thrive in the workplace.

During the 2024–2025 school year, Christian Academy of Indiana launched a Business Pathway designed to introduce students to foundational business concepts while helping them explore future career opportunities. The pathway includes a gateway course, Principles of Business Management, along with two concentrator courses, Foundations of Marketing and Accounting. Students may complete these courses at any point during their high school career, building practical skills that prepare them for college, careers and entrepreneurship.

Building on that momentum, the 2025–2026 school year introduced a new Career Exploration course for seniors. Through this program, students spend part of their school day interning with local businesses and nonprofit organizations, gaining firsthand experience in careers they may one day pursue.

To earn two semester credits, students complete at least 150 internship hours while meeting weekly with a faculty mentor who helps them navigate workplace challenges, reflect on their experiences and intentionally add value to the organizations they serve.

The inaugural year of the internship program was a tremendous success. Eighteen seniors completed the course over one or two semesters, contributing more than 5,400 internship hours across 19 local businesses and nonprofit organizations. Even more encouraging, three graduates received ongoing employment opportunities through their internships—a testament to both their preparation and the meaningful impact they made.

One senior reflected on her experience:

"The whole internship was a very valuable experience for me. The things I learned during my time will be very helpful throughout my career. I was able to learn about workplace relationships and see in person how problems are communicated and resolved."

As the Business Pathway continues to grow, CAI is seeking additional community partners to help shape the next generation of business leaders. Local entrepreneurs and organizations can support the program by offering internship opportunities or sharing their professional expertise as guest speakers.

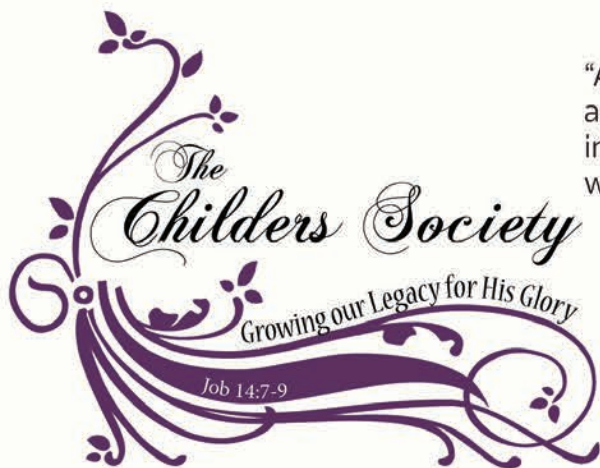
