INDIANA MINIMUM IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS QUICK REFERENCE FOR SCHOOL ENTRY 2018-2019

When a student enrolls in a school corporation, for the first time or at any subsequent time at any level, the parents must show either that the student has been immunized or that a current religious or medical objection is on file. Parents must provide the school corporation with complete immunization records prior to the beginning of the school year.

MINIMUM IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR STUDENTS ENROLLED AT KINDERGARTEN through GRADE FIVE:

- 5 doses of diphtheria-tetanus-acellular pertussis (DTaP), diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (DTP) or pediatric diphtheria-tetanus vaccine (DT) (4 doses are acceptable if the 4th dose was administered on or after the 4th birthday and at least 6 months after the 3rd dose);
- 4 doses of any combination of oral polio vaccine (OPV) or inactivated polio vaccine (IPV). The 4th dose **must** be administered on or after the 4th birthday, and at least 6 months after the previous dose;
- 2 doses of MMR (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) vaccine on or after the first birthday and separated by a minimum of 28 days;
- 3 doses of hepatitis B vaccine (3rd dose must be given on or after 24 weeks of age);
- 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine on or after the 1st birthday and separated by 3 months, <u>physician written</u> <u>documentation of history of chickenpox disease, including month and year of disease</u> is required for children entering preschool through 10th grade.
- 2 doses of Hepatitis A vaccine are required for students entering kindergarten, 1st grade, 2nd grade, 3rd grade AND 4th grade.
