Varsity Volleyball: (11-9)

On Monday vs. New Albany, the Warriors faced off against another 4A opponent. Falling behind in each of the three sets, the Warriors fought back, trading points with the Bulldogs the rest of the way. ULtimately, the Warriors fell to the Bulldogs (10-25/20-25/15-25). Kendall Kerberg led the team with 18 kills and 15 digs with Halle Rankin and Adeline Baldwin contributing nine and eight assists, respectively. Tuesday night was a one of celebration for our seniors, Kendall Kerberg and Halle Rankin. Both players have heavily contributed to the varsity team over the course of their four year careers. Also during the pre-match celebration, Kerberg was recognized and given a game ball for reaching her 1,000th career kill earlier this season in a match vs. Tecumseh High School. Rankin was then recognized and given a game ball for reaching her 1,000th career assist in the championship match last season vs. North Judson-San Pierre. Once the match started, the Warriors came out on fire, playing with heart and intensity in an effort to send out the seniors with a victory (25-18/25-15/25-20). Par for the course, both seniors contributed significantly in the win. Kerberg had four aces, 23 kills, two assists, 12 digs and 1 block assisted. Rankin had four aces, nine kills, 16 assists, and three digs.
