riday, November the 30th was supposed to be a routine day. It was anything but that, and will be forever seared in our hearts. Andrew Davis '04 lost his life along with prominent business man, Wayne Estopinal and another TEG Architect employee in a small plane crash while flying on a short business trip to Chicago. His love for aviation went back to at least his high school days. It was then that he told a long time family friend, Eric Erwin that he wanted to be pilot. Erwin, commenting on that moment said, "If I had a dime for every kid that told me they wanted to be a pilot I would be rich."

Andrew meant what he said and proceeded to get his pilot's license while in high school. From there he went on to receive his Bachelor's degree from Indiana State University. He had a goal and that was to become a UPS Pilot. He spent some time living in Muncie and Columbus before moving back to Louisville which he did at the suggestion of Erwin because UPS seems to like Louisville folks. Eric saw himself in Andrew who had a fire and drive that made him able to pursue his passion of aviation. Four days before the crash he had flown with Andrew, they enjoyed talking and sharing about what his future might look like. They would talk often and Andrew knew he could call his friend anytime for sound advice.

Longtime friend, Kyle Lee from his college years, told about meeting Andrew. "I remember meeting Andrew for the first time while attending Indiana State University and quickly feeling that I had known him forever. This was partly because we shared many commonalities, but more so because Andrew genuinely cared for others and could connect with anyone in impactful and lasting ways. I remember college for us consisting of road trips, studying, camping, discussions on life and how we would live our lives. Andrew made everyone around him better as he lived his life for others." said Lee. "One of the ways he made me better, and what made Andrew so special, was his ability to live a balanced life. He was the most determined friend that I had, pursuing his goals with discipline and rigor, yet holding loosely to his plans, trusting in the will of God for his life. Andrew was serious, yet lighthearted and joyous at the same time. He was futuristic (being my first friend to have an electric car) and old-fashioned (shaving with a straight blade razor). Andrew loved adventure and memories to be made, but was cautious and calculated. How he maintained this balance was inspiring!" Lee also commented, that many would call Andrew one of their best friends.

Michael Vollmer an Associate Pilot and Andrew's best friend from work at TEG Architects shared some thoughts about Andrew. "In pondering Andrew over the last week, I realized he was a deliberate balance of boyish innocence approach to life with manly convictions regarding his job, his friends, family and his faith. Andrew had his priorities right. He had so many stories, so much to talk about because he had so many neighbors, so many friends he loved. He never met a stranger...just a new friend he hadn't met yet." Volmer went on to say, "True measure of success in life is how many lives you made better." Andrew made so many lives better.

Andrew's last post on Facebook shared his excitement about his recent mission trip with his dad and his church to the Dominican Republic. What a sweet reminder of what was precious to him. Sharing his faith, loving his family and friends as well as pouring into others is what he did best. His wife Erica was the first to

encourage him as she expressed her support for his trip telling him that the people in the DR would fall in love with him and his group.

friends! He told me all about his job, his family, and where he was
from. Everything that his family and friends say about him is true,
he was just a genuine guy with a heart for others and a love for
Jesus. Thankful for that plane ride with him!"

His interests were many. He loved to travel, fish, woodwork, cycle, hike and he was a fantastic and thorough pilot. He truly never met a stranger. He had a passion to love others, to make you feel worthy and special. He had a indescribable love for his children and wife. A Christ-like love that so many deserve. His wife Erica and her family were in attendance at Northside Christian Church the Sunday after the accident. Surrounded by their church family ready to give love and support, they held tight to the hope that only those who know Jesus personally can rest in. Andrew was committed to making sure others knew this truth. He was passing it on to the next generation evidenced by his life, his family, friends and his involvement on his mission trip with Northside, where his outgoing personality was far reaching.

His loss will leave a huge void. Andrew was a dedicated husband, father, son, brother, uncle and more, he left an impact that will never be forgotten, His life reminds us that it is not the quantity of years that you live, it is the quality of the life you live and how you love and impact others.




