CAL Alum (Class of 2012) Taylor Smith Named to Bellarmine University Women's Soccer Team's All-Decade Team AND a Nominee for Player of the Decade!

With COVID-19 putting fall sports on the shelf this season, the Bellarmine Athletics Communication staff is using part of this time to shine the spotlight on some of the top student-athletes of the past 10 years by naming the Bellarmine All-Decade teams. The teams recognize student-athletes who competed for the Knights at least two seasons from the 2010-11 school year to the 2019-20 year. Additionally, Bellarmine fans are being asked to join in the process by casting votes for Player of the Decade.

Today, we name the Bellarmine All-Decade Team for Women's Soccer, which consists of 11 players reflecting a traditional starting lineup: one goalkeeper, four defenders, four midfielders and two forwards.

Goalkeeper — **Taylor Smith (2015-17)**

Smith capped her career in goal with an All-America senior campaign in which she was a second-team selection by the Division II Conference Commissioners Association and a third-team choice by the United Soccer Coaches. The Louisville native was a first-team All-Midwest Region pick by both those organizations. She also earned All-Midwest Region accolades as a sophomore and was named first-team All-GLVC that season and her final year.

Over three seasons and 44 games, Smith went 23-5-9 in goal with a 0.45 goals-against average, 0.884 save percentage and 23 shutouts. That GAA and save percentage rank first all-time in program history and her shutout tally is second. Smith is the single-season record holder in save percentage (0.908) and shutouts (13), both achieved in 2017. She was a three-time GLVC Defensive Player of the Week.

Smith was a first-team United Soccer Coaches Scholar All-American as a senior and earned the GLVC Scholar-Athlete of the Year award for women's soccer as well that year. She received the GLVC Council of Presidents Academic Excellence Award (exhaust eligibility while maintaining 3.5 cumulative GPA) and was career Academic All-GLVC.


