## Centurion Field Hockey is Headed Back to the STATE CHAMPIONSHIP!

CAL field hockey is headed back to the Kentucky High School Athletic Association State Field Hockey Championship! The Centurions will face Sacred Heart Academy for the fourth time on Monday night and the winner takes home the coveted State Championship. This past week CAL ran the gauntlet on their way back to the state finals for the third time in four years. CAL started the Regional Tournament as the top seed behind their undefeated regular season. They faced Eastern High School in their first match-up.

Although the Centurions took a much of the first period to get going, the outcome never appeared to be in doubt. In the end, CAL forced a mercy rule at 11-1 early in the fourth quarter. CAL scorers were led by Schoenbeck (3 goals, 2 assists), Thomas (2 goals, 1 assist), Krebs (2 goals, 1 assist), Doezenia (1 goal), Noltemeyer (1 goal), and Bearance (1 goal).

The regional championship brought a familiar and challenging foe. CAL won the two prior match-ups with Sacred Heart Academy this season, including a dramatic overtime win for the Apple Tournament Championship! The Valkyries were itching for revenge and took advantage early with a goal in the first five minutes of play and another in the last five minutes of the first quarter to lead 0-2 after just one quarter. CAL found themselves in new territory trailing for much of the game and fell behind 0-3 just after halftime. (continued on next page)

After a 2 week quarantine due to a positive COVID test on the team, the Centurions were eager to get back on the field on Friday 10/23, however, the skies opened up above Taziki's Field and due to a prolonged lightning delay, the game was postponed to a 10am start the following Sat. Once the squad awoke on a cold and overcast morning, there was little doubt of the outcome against the overmatched Wolverines, resulting in a 49-6 KO. The 3A, 3-2-2 Centurion's record versus the District 4 foe runs to 2-0.

But, this CAL squad has grit and resilience and at the start of the fourth quarter came roaring back with two quick goals by Wheeler and Krebs (both assisted by Thomas) within a two minute stretch bringing the score to 2-3. A ferocious battle ensued for much of the fourth quarter. Even until the end it seemed as if CAL would tie the score and force overtime, but Sacred Heart held onto a narrow victory.



The regional championship loss not only cost CAL their perfect record, but also gave them a lower seed in the state quarterfinals. Instead of playing 8th seeded Holy Cross, CAL drew the defending state champion Assumption Rockets. CAL had already defeated the Rockets twice this season but had their work cut out for them in earning their third win while at the Assumption Green field. CAL scored first with a goal by Bearance (assisted by Krebs) early in the second quarter. CAL held a 1-0 lead which it held for much of the game. Back and forth play ensued until the

fourth quarter when Assumption tied the score with on a corner. Six minutes later, Assumption scored again on nearly the same play and left the CAL faithful feeling anxious. With five minutes to play CAL trailed 2-1. The minutes slipped away and it looked like the Rockets would bring CAL's season of destiny to a premature end. But, CAL had a rocket of its own. As the clock ticked under 1 minute to play, junior speedster Jenna Doezema took the ball at midfield and shot past Rocket defenders, dribbling into the circle, attempting a pass to Bearance streaking into the goal mouth. The defender blocked the pass and the ball rolled back toward Doezema, who took the rebound and rifled it past the goalkeeper to tie the score with 47 seconds left in regulation. CAL had new life! Overtime brought 7 vs. 7 play and CAL seemed to control the action, but had trouble putting it into the cage, and it looked as if the game would go to a second overtime where the outcome would be decided with strokes (think penalty shot). But, senior captain Claudia Thomas would not let that happen. With just a minute to play she took on several defenders on the left side of the field, wove her way into the circle, and somehow neatly threaded a shot past the keeper for a 3-2 sudden death victory! Senior keeper Abby Lala led the defense with 16 saves on the night. CAL moved to 3-0 against Assumption on the season, a major accomplishment, but not the end goal for this squad.

The victory over Assumption set up a state semi-final match up at home against the Ballard Bruins on Saturday night. In the first semi-final of the night, Sacred Heart won 2-0 over Kentucky Country Day for their slot in Monday's state final. To meet up with Sacred Heart for the fourth time this season, CAL would first have to pass a major test against a motivated and speedy Ballard squad. The Bruins came out roaring. Just five minutes into play, the officials called a stroke and the Bruins took advantage for a 1-0 lead. Less than a minute later, Ballard scored again on a fast break and for the second time in a week, CAL faced an early 2-0 deficit in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter.



Things looked very bleak from the stands, but resilient teams find ways to win and Coach Stephanie Seeley's squad simply did not give up. The defensive line (freshman Megan Mauzy, junior Emma Morgeson, senior Mollie Moses, and senior Molly Mast) would hold the Bruins scoreless the rest of the night in front of senior Abby Lala's stellar play. Meanwhile the midfield and offense continued to put the pressure on the Bruins. Midway through the second quarter senior Elise Bearance scored on a corner to narrow the Bruin lead to 2-1.



Shortly after halftime it was sophomore Anne Marie Krebs who evened the score 2-2 on another corner. CAL again controlled play and held onto the 2-2 tie at the end of regulation. Overtime brought a 7 vs. 7 sudden death period. CAL appeared to have the advantage and repeatedly navigated the ball into striking distance, including several tries in the last three minutes, but the first overtime period would end scoreless. Now, the game that started with a stroke would end with a stroke. Each team selected five players to take a stroke, one on one with the keeper. CAL brought out Claudia Thomas, Mollie Moses, Elise Bearance, Mia Schoenbeck, and Anne Marie Krebs, and defending the CAL goal was, of course, Abby Lala.

Thomas lined up first. Goal! CAL was up 1-0.

Ballard lined up against Lala, who appeared to be more than ready for the challenge. The Ballard shooter went left, but Lala deftly knocked away the shot with a stick save before a roaring crowd of CAL faithful.

Moses lined up second. Goal! CAL was up 2-0.



The next Ballard player snuck one by Lala. 2-1.



Bearance lined up third. Goal! CAL up 3-1.

Ballard lined up their third shooter, who aimed for the right corner but was denied by a diving Lala! CAL was up 3-1, and one more goal would seal the victory.

Schoenbeck confidently walked to the stripe, looked the keeper in the eye, and gave a small nod. The end was near. The referee

blew the whistle. Schoenbeck took one last look and blasted the winning goal!

The victory sent CAL to the state championship on Monday night at 7:30 (Centurion Stadium) and set up a rematch of their only loss on this stellar season. You won't want to miss this epic championship! Go CAL-TAKE STATE!

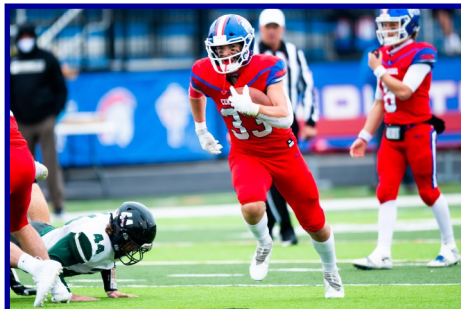

The 5th and 6th grade Centurion football team took their 4-1 record on the road to play the J-Town Bulldogs. It was a cloudy, chilly 57 degrees at kickoff (football weather!!!). A summary of the game would read: **CAL's offense made big play after big play, great offensive line blocking and incredible defense forcing punt after punt.**



**1st Half** - Ty Bindner secured the opening kickoff for CAL. Nic Doster ran for 7 yards on the opening play followed by a Jayden Leak 49-yard touchdown run! Jackson Burke ran in the extra point (7-0 CAL). The defense stuffed the Bulldogs opening drive with Kellan Hall and Nolan Flores making great tackles forcing a punt. CAL takes over and Sam Bates starts the drive with a super 20-yard catch from Burke. Leak runs for another 20 yards and

Will Graham runs in for the touchdown! Extra point no good (13 - 0 CAL). After kicking off, CAL's defense continues to make great tackles by Braeden Meade, Riley Baker, Micah Newsome and Flores forcing another punt. Not to be outdone, the CAL offense showed big range today with two more long runs by Lewis.
