CAL FIELD HOCKEY IS 9-0!



On Thursday, Oct.1, the Lady Centurion Varsity Soccer team traveled across the river to face the Providence Pioneers and proceeded to leave them behind in the wilderness with a solid 3-0 shut out.

CAL started off the game with an aggressive offensive attack. Just two minutes into the game, senior Caroline Andres threw the ball far across the field into the box from a throw-in. After a deflection, senior Abby Roberts struck the ball into the net, as it rolled between multiple players' feet.



The Centurions maintained possession the majority of the game with good passing patterns. The mid-field, led by juniors Lilly Andres, Olivia Possidento, and Lily Holbrook, did a stellar job throughout the game of distributing the ball forward to sophomore Morgan Coffey and senior wings Hannah Johnson and Abby Rob-



At 21 minutes, Lilly Andres sent a pass thru to Roberts, who carried the ball all the way up the right side of the field, sent a perfect cross over to **Johnson**. She had a solid shot that was saved by the skilled Pioneer goalkeeper. The next few minutes saw another CAL offensive attack initiated by Roberts, passed to freshman Luna Guarin, then to Johnson, only to be stopped again by the keeper. Then Caroline Andres had a terrific shot as well, also met by the keeper.

Collectively, the girls managed 24 shots throughout the game, most of which were on target to the goal. The Pioneers senior goalkeeper was very skilled and amassed 13 saves during the game.

During the second half, the Centurions continued to dominate possession, which meant that much of the game was played on the Pioneer half of the field, making for a crowded field to move the ball. This half, the Pioneers stepped up their attack, pressing the Centurion defense. 
CAL EARNS 2ND WIN OVER HENRY COUNTY!


