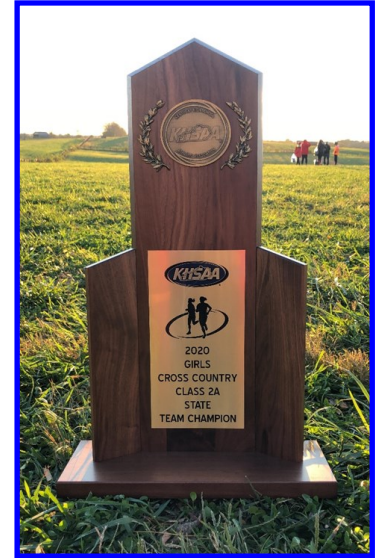

Their final game of a great season was played Saturday (a perfect sunny 53 degree afternoon). The football Centurions were home against the Radcliff Hurricanes (Canes), two teams with similar talent. Wining would come down to execution and effort.

All season long the coaches filled the boys up with Biblical inspiration - PUT ON THE FULL ARMOR OF GOD!

1st Qtr - CAL received the opening kickoff and the offense went to work. Jayden Leak runs for 9 yards. Ty Bindner goes for 5 yards and a first down. Leak run right, nothing there and reverse field for a 21 yard gain. Then Jackson Burke throws a perfect pass to Sam Bates for a 25 yard touchdown. (CAL 6-0). CAL kicks off and Aaron Soete makes a great open field tackle. The CANES throw a great pass but Noah Martin makes a touchdown saving tackle. On the next play, the CANES break free for a 25 yard touchdown run and the Canes lead 7-6 at the end of the first quarter.



2nd Qtr - The Canes had the ball to open the second quarter but CAL's defense forced them to punt. CAL starts their drive with another Burke to Bates pass for 40 yards! Burke then hits Braeden Meade for a 20 yards. Then a touchdown pass to Ty Bindner, extra point completion to Bates giving CAL a 13-7 lead. Jackson Burke was throwing darts!

CAL kicks off and Madden Miller makes a great tackle along with Riley Baker. Carson Hahn and Nolan Flores made great tackle after tackle that led to a Radcliff fumble. Meade starts the drive with a 20 yard gain. Nic Doster runs for a crucial first down. Burke then hits Meade for a touchdown pass with *seven seconds* to go in the half. Burke runs in the extra point and the Centurions lead 20-7. The coaching staff saved enough time for this final score of the half by using key time outs. WELL DONE COACHES.

3rd Qtr - CAL kicks off and Jake Elder makes a great opening tackle but the Canes excellent running back (#4) runs for a 70 yard touchdown making the score 20-13. Racliff attempts an onside kick but Carson Hahn fields the ball nicely. CAL next drive featured hard runs by Doster, great catches by Bates and a nifty screen pass to Leak for a touchdown. CAL leads 26-13. CAL kicks off and Madden Miller makes another great tackle. Kellan Hall sets the defensive tone with a great tackle causing a 5 yard loss. The Canes fumble the ball and CAL has it 1st and goal on the 8-yard line to end the quarter. (CAL 26-13)



4th - On 3rd and goal Burke hits Leak for a touchdown and Bates catches the extra point! CAL extends the lead to 33-13. The Canes outstanding running back runs for a 47-yard touchdown on the next series making it CAL 33-19. Radcliff kicks off and Meade makes a super kickoff return. Leak continues his great running on the next series setting up a touchdown pass from Burke to Meade (CAL 39-19).

CAL kicks off and Justin Jorden and Joey Hough team up to make a great tackle. The defense shuts down the Canes last drive featuring a great pass breakup by Noah Martin. CAL wins a classic 39-19.

Unfortunately, Due to COVID-19 concerns, playoffs were cancelled, but ***this team is a champion!*** Hats off to Head Coach Hall and his wonderful assistant coaches. A big thank you to Team Mom Carrie Meade and the always working Rebecca Mauzy!
