On a perfect night in Elizabethtown, KY, the 7-2 Centurions continued their "murderers row" run in the 3A playoffs facing the 11-0 Panthers of Elizabethtown High in the 3A Regional Championships, however were unable to continue their streak falling eventually 39-20.. Their overall record versus the Panthers goes to 2-3.

The 7-3 Centurions end their season.

It was to be a herculean task for the Centurions. The Panthers were senior-laden, returning the core of the 2019 "Sweet

16" Panthers' hoops squad including standout twins, Kam and Kaiya Sherrard as well as other potential 2-way D1 standouts.

It was evident early on that CAL was going to have difficulties with Etown's lateral quickness, however their first drive

stalled and were forced to punt. CAL's first drive was hallmarked by several runs by Brandt Babin down to the Etown 20, but CAL's first of too many turnovers occurred after Camden Williams stripped CAL's "ironman" WR Gage Geren on about the 12. Etown capitalized with a long reverse by 22 for 50+ yards, taking a 7-0 lead. CAL then returned the KO by Babin to the 48



and several runs and nice pitch and catch to Messer, were in business on the Etown 30. But after a "shoe" substitution for the RB, CAL fumbled it right back to Etown. Fortunately Isaac Satterfield saved us with a HUGE 3rd down sack forcing Etown to punt.CAL then drove 70 yards capped off by a 20 yard scamper by Babin about 1:00 into the 2nd quarter. Somehow the game was tied 7-7. Likely 2 TDs had been left on the field by CAL as they hadn't been stopped and Etown had 2 punts. But Etown struck on a deep ball and nice catch by




22 then eventually scored to go up 14-7. After a 3 and out and CAL punt, more lateral speed and Etown put up more points albeit a FG to go up 17-7 with under 4:50 remaining in 2nd qtr. An untimely "turf monster" bounce put us in a hole inside our 10. We were unable to extricate ourselves, punting into the wind with Etown starting another drive in our territory. A big 3rd and long conversion downfield setup another score and Etown goes up 24-7 with 2:00 to go in the half. CAL kep the ball in the air however and another drive stalled out with a safety coming on a snap over the punter's

point conversion. Then a pick 6 by Brandt Babin made it 26-20 with under 7:00 to go in the third. But, it wasn't meant to be. Too many mistakes, the penalty flags started flying at crucial times against CAL and too much speed on the edges. CAL was still in the game late down 33-20 but a long drive of over 8:00 with no points by Etown in the 4th killed our chances. The eventual score was 39-20 but MUCH closer than that!!



Kudos to the O-line which played a tremendous game controlling the line of scrimmage for the run game (even without their starting TE) and the D-line who played as well as possible considering their starting DE (same kid, William Paar) was out with mono. It also marked a return to the DL for Braeden Babin.
