

Win or lose. Live or die. The senior quartet has been playing together wearing the red, white, and blue since sixth grade, each with a different role. Haun is the Dennis Rodman of the bunch, diving, kicking, and deflecting. Wearsch blocks shots and scores with a smooth array of Dirk

Nowitzki moves. Lagestee is the tough rebounding guard like Terry Rozier who shoots the three like Kyle Korver. Lagestee was hit in the face during the fourth quarter and bled all over the floor and sideline, halting the game for a 7 minute clean up (the refs didn't see it and never called a foul). We thought his night was over. But he somehow made a miraculous clotting recovery and put himself back out on the floor for the last sequence. His presence drew a double team allowing Haun to get open for the final shot. Daniels is the Gary Payton lock down defender of the group, using his athletic ability to cover the other team's best offensive player. This quartet has won well over 100 games going back six years.

Another stellar offensive performance, CAL again shot over fifty percent from the field (51%). George Washington continued his torrid scoring pace netting 32 points with 3 three pointers. Stephen Wearsch hit 55% of his shots en route to 12 and 5 rebounds. Brayden Daniels had 7 and 6. Tyler Lagestee had 3 and 5. Erhardt 9. Hodge 4.

## *January 23, 2021* CAL 51 Beechwood 71

CAL added a last minute game Saturday night up along the river in northern Kentucky against Beechwood High school. After playing great basketball over the last four games, CAL came out flat and put up a sub par performance, losing by 20. We just never got it going this night. Give Beechwood credit, though, as they were well coached and hounded us defensively. They obviously watched film on us. They doubled teamed Washington and kept hand and body checking him throughout the night stopping our flow. The refs never called it. That being said, down about 15 points in the 3rd quarter, we were able to make a run and close the gap to 3 points led by Wearsch. The senior captain scored 9 points in the quarter, on his way to 17 points and 10 rebounds overall. In a rare highlight, Wearsch grabbed a big rebound and threw a nice full court football pass to George Washington for a monstrous dunk that shocked the spectators. The deep Beechwood team, however, would gradually pull away in the fourth. Washington finished with 15 and Haun had 8 and 8.
