ACT/SAT

- Take for entire junior class at CAL March 16th
- Register NOW for a test, online at act.org
- Take the test *again* your senior year
- May want to take a prep class after your first test (i.e. try using Method Test Prep and act.org)
- Include your Social Security Number when you register for the test
- Register for the SAT online at collegeboard.org

2 most important factors for colleges!

UNIVERSITY OF KENTUCKY

50% of freshmen have a 3.68 GPA

50% of freshmen have a 22-28 ACT

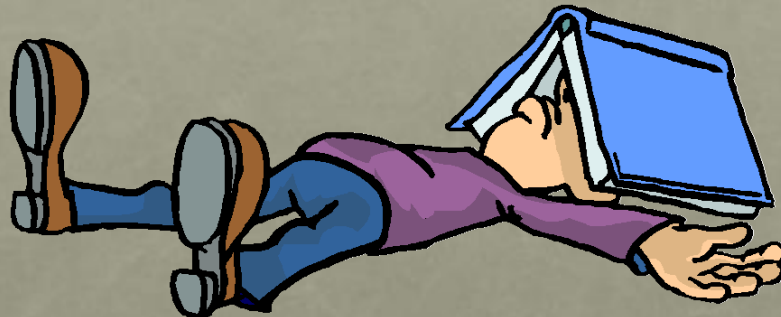

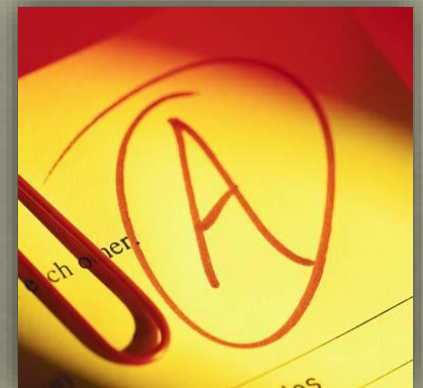
STRONGLY SUGGEST

- Academic Subjects
- Science for 4 years (transfer students must take physics)
- Colleges look closely at senior schedule especially selective schools
- Colleges know you usually only have a few classes left ...they want to see that you aren't taking a break senior year



ADVANCED PLACEMENT

- College level course
- Must have recommendation requirements
- Must pass exam in order to have college credit
- Great preparation
- \$100 fee charged for the exam



DUAL ENROLLMENT (DE)

- Be aware of minimum GPA
- ACT — A minimum composite score with a certain sub-score in the subject area that corresponds with the high school dual credit course may be required, or
- PSAT – composite may be required in a certain percentile

We suggest a strong academic schedule

- Allows you the opportunity to investigate a profession in which you may be interested in majoring
 - You receive a grade and 1 credit
- May leave every day after 3rd block when register for 2 blocks; if only register for one block will leave every other day

SPORTS IN COLLEGE

- You **MUST** register with the NCAA if you think you will play for a Division I or II school (your counselor will help you check classes); 16 core course requirements
- NAIA also has a clearinghouse for which you must register to play in one of these schools

WHAT ELSE...?

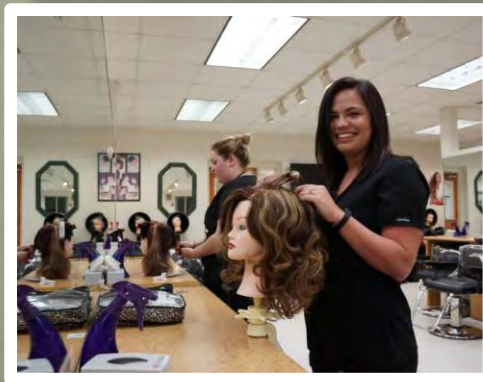
- Seniors get first pick with electives
