

The Christian Academy Louisville baseball team split four games during the second week of the season with a 2021 record now standing at 4-4.



CAL opened their week on Monday using a six-run fifth inning to break a 4-4 tie with Christian Educational Consortium (CEC) in winning the home game, 11-5.

CAL went 3 up 3 down the first time through the lineup, but things started looking up when the bats came alive in the 4th. Junior catcher Macie Howes got the Centurions going, as she often does, with a

solo home run to start the 4th. The solo blast was followed by a single up the middle from Sophomore left fielder Madison Raley who later scored on a 2 out hit by Junior Shortstop Hailey Fante-Hall.

In the 5th, Junior Karly Fetter hit a solo home run to center making it 3-2. CAL added two insurance runs in the 6th as the top of the lineup reached base and scored on a single to left by Senior Katelyn Christensen.

Grayson County tried to mount a rally in the last with a solo shot, but it wasn't enough. CAL won 5-3 in a tough one led by Ava Manning's brilliance on the mound only giving up 3 hits with 7 strikeouts.

The Lady Centurions took right back to the field Friday evening to play a tough 8 -1 team from Butler County. The CAL offense was firing on all cylinders in the nightcap, as the game was back and forth through the first 3 innings with CAL ahead 4-3.

Junior Macie Howes doubled and scored to start the game, and added another run on a solo shot to start the 3rd inning. After two CAL batters reached on error, Junior Karly Fetter drove them both in with a 2 RBI double down the right field line.

CAL got the fireworks going again in the 4th with back to back doubles by Senior First baseman Regan Gray and Howes. After an infield hit by Raley, Gray scored on a deep sacrifice fly to right by Sophomore pitcher Ava Manning. Sen-

ior Katlyn Christensen added another double to score Howes and Junior Hailey Fante-Hall put a long charge into a ball to center, scoring Raley on the sacrifice fly. CAL led 8-3 to end the 4th and both teams added runs in the 5th with CAL's being on a solo home run to left center by Senior Regan Gray. Butler County added their own 2 run homer in the bottom half of the inning.

CAL wasn't quite done yet, Howes, Raley and Manning all reached and scored in the 7th to add more cushion to the lead. It wasn't really needed though as Ava Manning kept the tough hitting Butler County lineup off balance all night. Manning went the distance for the victory striking out 7 along the way to bring her record to 5-3 on the year. Sophomore Trinity Chelf played a gem in right field making multiple crucial plays while Freshman Sam Durston got the start at 2nd base and provided an excellent defensive performance turning a key double play.

On Monday night, The Lady Centurions hosted Frankfort as part of a home and away series this year. CAL scratched out of the gate as Junior Catcher Macie Howes doubled and scored on a sacrifice bunt by #2 hitter Madison Raley in the first inning.

The bats were quiet on both sides until the 4th inning when Frankfort added 2 runs, but the action really began in this one in the 6th inning. After Frankfort added another in the top of the 6th, CAL rallied behind a triple by Senior Regan Gray, and a 2 run homer by Howes, followed by a bunt single from Raley who scored on a 3 base error.



Frankfort added one more in the top of 7 to tie the game but in dramatic fashion, Junior 3rd baseman Marlee Pettit tripled off the right center field wall and scored on a suicide squeeze by Senior center fielder Katelyn Christensen to give CAL the 5-4 victory. Ava Manning got the win on the mound recording 9 strikeouts along the way.

walk, Raley had a bunt single and Shortstop Hailey Fante-Hall added an RBI double to stretch the lead to 5-1.





Adam Ballard lined a single over the second baseman's head and Johnny Pohlman bunted for a single to load the bases. Jack Mauzy drew a walk to score Zeller and tie the game at 1-1. Bal-

lard scored on a passed ball to give CAL a 2-1 lead with Mauzy advancing to second base. Jett Peterson and Jack Perdue followed with successive sacrifice flies to score Pohlman and Mauzy to give CAL a 4-1 lead.

CEC regained the lead with a three-run fifth inning before CAL exploded for six runs of their own in the bottom half of the frame. Peterson and Perdue both sin-



gled to centerfield to start the inning and Nick Britton drew a walk to load the bases. Jacob Price singled to left to score Peterson and Marshall Mowder reached on an infield single to score Perdue. Britton scored when Moad reached on an error by the third baseman and Price scored on a wild pitch, giving CAL an 8-4 lead. Pohlman walked before Mowder scored on a passed ball. Zeller (running for Moad) scored the final run of the inning when Peterson singled to left field, CAL leading 10-4.




CEC scored once in the sixth as did the Centurions. Britton tripled to right field to lead off the inning and scored on Price's sacrifice fly to centerfield, CAL's third sacrifice fly of the game. The runs accounted for the final score of 11-5.

CAL had 11 hits in the game. Nick Britton had a triple and a single while Adam Ballard and Jett Peterson both had two singles. Jack Perdue, Jacob Price, Marshall MOwder, Bradey Moad, and John Pohlman all singled once.

Nathaniel Turner started the game on the mound, going four innings, allowing only one run while striking out five. Ben Kirk, Adam Ballard, and Noah McCarty all pitched for CAL with Ballard earning the win and McCarty a relief save for CAL.

On Tuesday, CAL begin a two-week trek of games on the road by falling to Oldham County, 6-5, in LaGrange.

Oldham County scored twice in the first inning and once in the second to take an 3-0 lead. CAL scored twice in the top of the third inning to narrow the gap to 3-2. Ben Kirk started the inning by reaching base on a dropped third strike and moved to second base when Johnny Pohlman walked. Jett Peterson singled to left field to load the bases with no one out. Kirk scored when Jack Mauzy reached base on an error by the third baseman. One out later, Pohlman scored on Jacob Price's sacrifice fly to centerfield.



CAL tied the game in the top of the fifth inning. With two outs, Mauzy reached base on an infield single and advanced to third when Nick Britton lined a single to right field. Mauzy then scored on a wild pitch to tie the game at 3-3.

Oldham scored three times in the bottom of the fifth inning to take a 6-3 lead, a lead which CAL could not overcome. The Centurions did score twice more in the sixth. Price reached base on an error to start the inning. Braeden Davis, pinch running for Price, advanced to second base on a passed ball. One out later, Jack Perdue reached on a bunt single with Davis moving to third with Perdue then stealing second base. With two outs, Davis and Perdue both scored when Will Thompson reached on an infield single, narrowing the game to the final 6-5 score.

CAL had six hits in the game, all singles: Jett Peterson had two hits, while Jack Mauzy, Nick Britton, Will Thompson, and Jack Perdue all

had one. Jacob Price and Will Thompson pitched for CAL.

CAL's third game of the week was a 6-4 extra inning win over Ryle played at the UC Health Stadium in Florence, Ky. Landon Mullaney pitched a jewel of a game, pitching a one-hitter, allowing only one unearned run in seven innings of work.



Ryle scored their unearned run in the bottom of the first inning before CAL tied the score in the top of the fourth. Adam Ballard lined a single to right field with one out before stealing second base and advancing to third base on a wild pitch. Ballard scored the tying run on a Johnny Pohlman ground ball.

The score remained tied at 1-1 until the eighth inning. Nicholas Britton and Ben Kirk both walked to lead off the inning and Bradey Moad bunted for a single to load the bases. Jack Perdue drew a walk to score Britton and give CAL a 2-1 lead. Kirk scored on a Landon Mullaney ground ball and Moad scored when Ballard lined a single to left with Perdue advancing to third base. Perdue scored on a Pohlman sacrifice fly and Ballard scored when Jett Peterson lined a single to centerfield, giving CAL an 6-1 lead. Ryle used eight different pitchers in the eight inning contest. Ryle did rally for three runs in the bottom of the eighth inning before reliever Adam Ballard induced two ground balls to get the final two outs and stop the rally.



CAL had seven hits in the game, all singles. Adam Ballard and John Pohlman each singled twice with Jett Peterson, Landon Mullaney, and Bradey Moad all singling once. As mentioned, Mullaney pitched seven innings, allowing only one hit in recording the pitching win. Phillip Fetter and Adam Ballard pitched the final inning.

In a Friday game, North Oldham scored five times in the fourth inning to secure an 8-1 win over the Centurion at North Oldham High School.

North Oldham scored single runs in the second and third innings to take a 2-0 lead before CAL scored their only run of the game in the fourth inning. Nick Britton began the inning by reaching on an infield error and moved to third base when Adam Ballard singled to centerfield. Britton scored CAL's on Jack Perdue's infield ground out. North Oldham then scored five runs in the bottom half of the inning and once in the sixth in winning, 8-1.

CAL had five singles in the game, two by Jett Peterson and one each from Adam Ballard, Will Thompson, and Marshall Mowder. Jack Perdue, Phillip Fetter, and Will Thompson all pitched in the game for CAL.

CAL will be focusing on the Kentucky 2A Sectional tournament for the upcoming week. On Monday, CAL will travel to Thomas Nelson High School for a 5:30 game in their tournament opener, a game that has been postponed twice by rain on Saturday and on Sunday. If CAL wins on Monday, the Centurions will travel to Nelson County High School to play in the second round on Tuesday. A Tuesday win would mean the Centurions will play in the third round, again at Nelson County. If CAL wins on Thursday, the Kentucky 2A tournament will conclude on the weekend of April 23-25 in Owensboro. Meanwhile, on Saturday, CAL will play at Lexington Catholic to play a 4:00 afternoon game. CAL's next home game will be versus Holy Cross on Monday, April 19, at 5:00.

He also was able to strike out 12 Colonels. The Centurion offense was led by hits from Alex Ullom, Jackson Watkins, Alex Yarberry and Nathan King. King was responsible for 3 RBI's. Smart base running also helped CAL, with stolen bases from Cameron Combs, Ullom and Watkins. Bradey Moad frustrated the Oldham County base runners with ex-



cellent plays from behind the plate. Harned finished up the win by striking out the last two Colonel batters.



The Centurions suffered their first loss on Thursday night to the North Oldham Mustangs. Nathan King started on the mound for CAL. Pitching and fielding errors cost the Centurions 6 runs in the first 3 innings. The defense tightened up, however, and did not allow any more scoring. King, Patrick Snider, Alex Yar-

berry and Jackson Watkins all assisted in two double plays against the Mustangs. Unfortunately, the offense could not put runs on the
