By defeating two Nelson County area teams this past week, the Christian Academy Louisville Centurions' baseball team has earned a spot to play in the Kentucky 2A Championships in Owensboro!



CAL played two games early in the week in Bardstown to earn the opportunity. On Monday, the Centurions scored ten runs in the second inning while pitchers Jacob Price and Nathaniel Turner combined on a three-hitter in shutting out Thomas Nelson High School, 12-0. 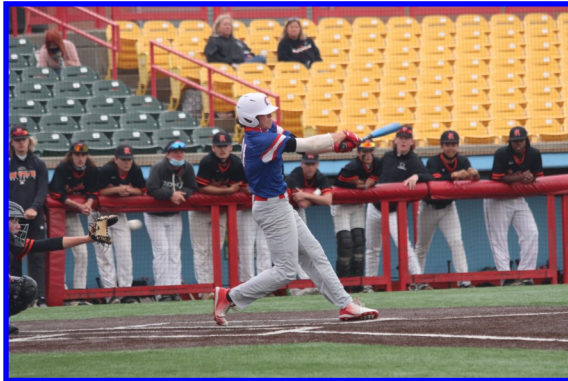

The Centurions scored twice in the first inning. Jett Peterson opened the game by reaching base on an infield error, stole second base, and scored on Marshall Mowder's flyball single to centerfield. Mowder stole second base before Jack Mauzy walked and Adam Ballard reached on an error to load the bases with no outs. One out later, Jack Perdue hit into a force play with Mowder scoring and giving CAL a 2-0 lead.



CAL sent 15 batters to the plate in the second inning, scoring ten runs and accounting for the remainder of scoring in the 12-0 CAL victory. Avery Hare lined a double with one out and scored when Logan McNair lined a double of his own to right field. Peterson lined a single to right to score McNair before Mowder walked and Mauzy bunted for a single to load the bases. Ballard doubled to centerfield scoring Peterson and Mowder with Mauzy stopping at third base. Nick Britton singled to right, scoring Mauzy and Ballard advancing to third base. One out later, Jacob Price doubled to right field, scoring Ballard with Britton stopping at third. Noah McCarty ran for pitcher Price and Hare followed with a two-run single, scoring both Britton and McCarty and giving CAL a 10-0 lead. McNair lined his second double of the inning before Peterson collected his second single of the inning, scoring both Hare and McNair and giving CAL an insurmountable 12-0 lead.



Meanwhile, Jacob Price and Nathaniel Turner were shutting down the Thomas Nelson offense which had scored 15 runs in their previous game. Price pitched three innings and Turner two in limiting Thomas Nelson HS to only three hits and one walk while striking out 10 batters.

Logan McNair, Jett Peterson, Jack Mauzy, and Avery Hare all had two hits for the Centurions. McNair had two doubles, Hare had a double and a single, and Peterson and Mauzy each had two singles. Jacob Price and Adam Ballard both doubled while Nick Britton and Marshall Mowder both singled.

On Tuesday, CAL continued their offensive onslaught on Nelson County teams by rapping out 21 hits and took advantage of eight errors in defeating Nelson County High School on their home field, 17-8.

Avery Hare collected five of the Centurions' 21 hits and drove home five runs, while Nick Britton also reached base five times with three hits and two walks and had three RBI.

After leaving five runners on base in the first two innings, CAL erupted for six runs in the top of the third inning. The Centurions loaded the bases with no outs with a Marshall Mowder walk, an Adam Ballard single, and a Nick Britton walk. Two fielder's choice ground balls later, Avery Hare tripled on a line drive to right field to clear the bases. Hare scored on Logan McNair's line drive single and McNair scored when Jett Peterson tripled to centerfield. Jack Mauzy's line drive single to center scored Peterson and gave CAL a 6-0 lead, a lead they would not relinquish.

Nelson County did counter with four runs of their own in the bottom of the third frame, but CAL scored in every inning the remainder of the game in cruising to the 17-8 victory.

Nick Britton drew a lead off fourth inning walk, stole second, and scored on a two-out Hare single to left field, CAL now leading 7-4.

In the fifth, Mowder walked with one out, stole second and scored on a two-out double by Britton, CAL leading 8-4. (continued on next page)



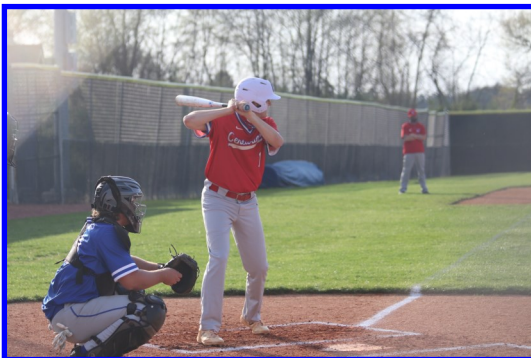
In the sixth, Noah McCarty reached base on an infield single with one out, advanced to second on a passed ball, and scored when Hare lined a single into centerfield, CAL now leading 9-4.



CAL blew the game open in the top of the seventh inning, scoring eight runs and taking a 17-4 lead. Adam Ballard singled to lead off the inning and scored when Nick Britton doubled to left. Ben Kirk drew a walk and Noah McCarty lined a single to right, scoring Britton and Kirk scoring on a throwing error by the first baseman. Avery Hare reached on an infield single and advanced to second base with McCarty scoring on a throwing error by the shortstop. Logan McNair doubled to right field with Hare scoring and Jett Peterson then reached on infield error with McNair advancing to third base. McNair scored on a Jack Mauzy sacrifice fly and Peterson scored when Marshall Mowder doubled to right field. Mowder scored on Britton's second hit of the inning, CAL now leading 17-4. Nelson County scored four runs in the bottom half of the seventh inning.

In a game that lasted three hours and nine minutes, CAL's Avery Hare had five hits including a triple and four singles with five runs batted in. Nick Britton reached base five times: two doubles, one single, two walks, while collecting three RBI and scoring two runs. Jack Mauzy had a double and a single while Jett Peterson, Adam Ballard, and Noah McCarty had two singles each. Marshall Mowder had a double and Landon Mullaney singled. Ten different Centurion players scored runs in the game. Jack Perdue pitched four innings in relief for CAL to earn the victory, including striking out six consecutive batters over two innings in the game. Landon Mullaney started the game on the mound for CAL and Will Thompson relieved in the game to record the final three outs.

Later in the week, the Centurions battled to two one-run heartbreaking losses in evening their season record to 6-6.



CAL opened district play on Thursday at Ballard and allowed two unearned runs in falling to the district rival, 2-1.

Ballard scored their first run in the bottom of the first inning and held on to this lead until the fifth inning when CAL tied the game at 1-1.

Noah McCarty lined a one-out double into left field and advanced to third base on a Nathaniel Turner ground ball, before scoring on Logan McNair's ground ball single into centerfield. It proved to be CAL's only run of the game as Ballard scored a second unearned run in the bottom of the sixth to win the game, 2-1.

CAL had eight hits, led by Jett Peterson's two singles. Adam Ballard and Noah McCarty both doubled while Avery Hare, Logan McNair, Ben Kirk, and Nick Britton all singled. Nathaniel Turner started the game on the mound for CAL and pitched five innings, allowing no earned runs and four hits while striking out eight. Jacob Price pitched in relief for CAL.

On Saturday, the Centurions traveled to Lexington and came out on the losing end of a 5-4 battle to Lexington Catholic.

CAL took an early 4-0 lead, but could not hold on, scoring three runs in the top of the first inning and one more in the second. (continued on next page)

CAL loaded the bases in the first inning when Logan McNair and Marshall Mowder both singled and Adam Ballard reached by an error with one out. McNair and Mowder scored when Nick Britton lined a single into right field and Ballard scored when Avery Hare singled into left field, giving CAL a 3-0 lead.

The Centurions scored their fourth and final run in the second inning. Jacob Price lined a single to left field to open the inning (Noah McCarty now courtesy running for the pitcher, Price). Jett Peterson grounded a single into right field to advance McCarty to third base and McCarty scored on a McNair sacrifice fly.

That completed the Centurions' scoring for the day as Lexington Catholic scored twice in the second and once each in the third and the fourth innings to tie the game at 4-4. Lexington Catholic scored their final run in the bottom half of the seventh inning on a two-out infield hit to earn a walk-off 5-4 win. Three of Lexington Catholic's runs were unearned in the game. CAL left nine runners on base and could not take advantage of seven Lexington Catholic errors. Four of the nine CAL runners left on base were stranded on third base.

Nick Britton had three of CAL's nine hits in the game, all singles, while Jacob Price had two hits, a double off the left field wall and a single. Jett Peterson, Logan McNair, Marshall Mowder, and Avery Hare all singled once. Jacob Price went the distance on the mound for CAL, allowing two earned runs and striking out eight batters.

After two weeks of road games, CAL will play three consecutive games at home. On Monday, CAL host Holy Cross at 5:00 before playing district rival Kentucky Country Day on Tuesday at 6:30. On Thursday, Portland Christian will visit on Senior Night for a 6:00 ballgame. On Friday, CAL will travel to Owensboro's Shifley Park to play Bardstown in the Kentucky 2A Championship tournament with a game time of 8:00 Eastern time. Follow-up games are at 2:00 and 7:00 (Eastern times) on Saturday in the single elimination tournament.

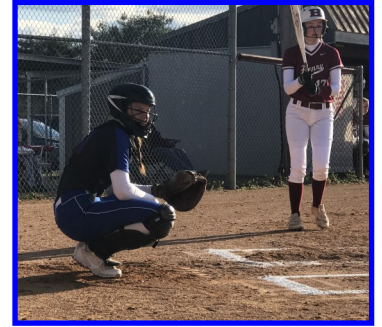

CAL vs Henry County Wildcats Thursday April 15th

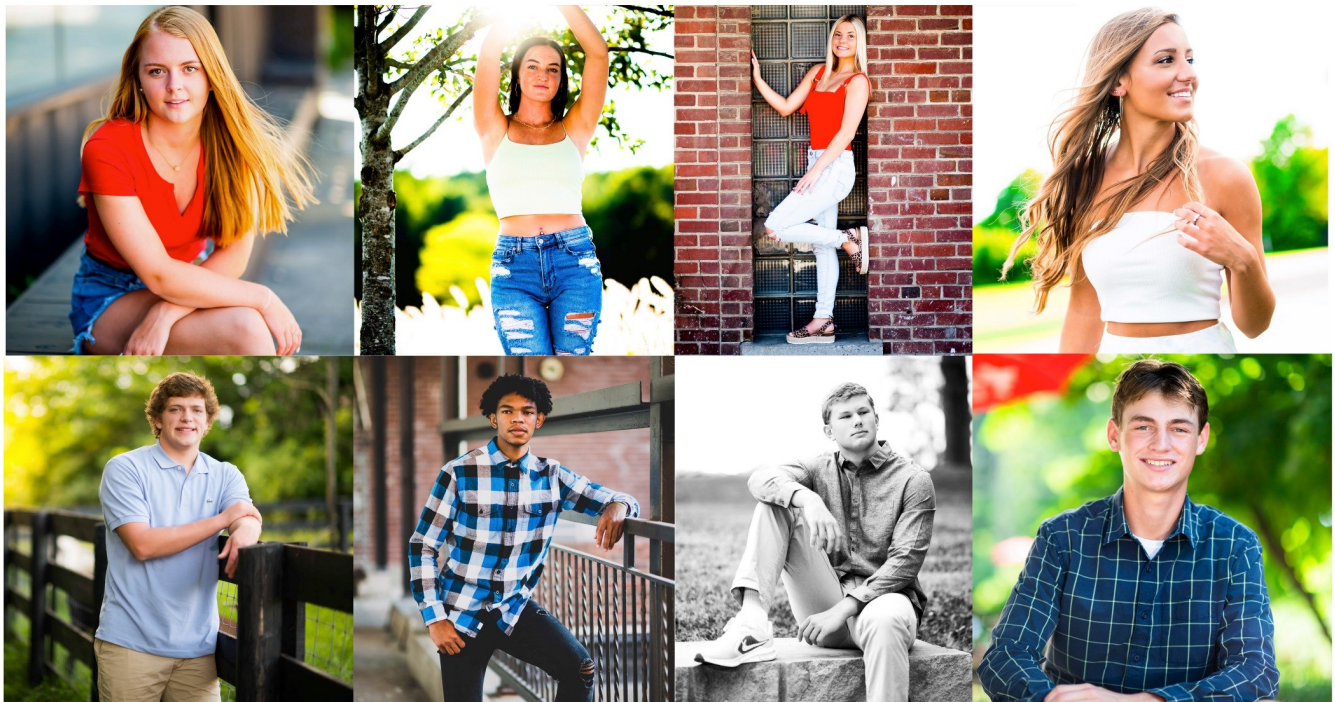

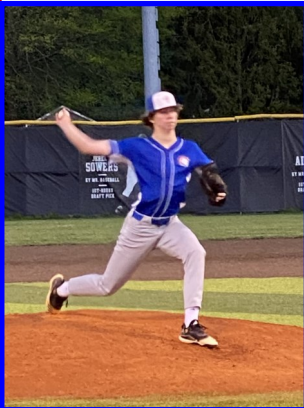

Freshmen Baseball Ends Tough Week with Big Win at Lexington Catholic

The Centurion Freshmen played Ballard twice last week. On Monday night, CAL was outscored 14-4 by a heavy hitting Bruins team. Nolan Wahl and Cameron Combs pitched for the Centurions. The offense was led by hits from Jackson Watkins, Bradey Moad, Patrick Snider, Parker Price and Hayden Peck. Moad also had 3 RBI's. Watkins, Peck and Alex Ullom advanced with stolen bases. Ballard proved unstoppable from the plate, however, and easily took the win.



Unfortunately, Tuesday night brought similar results with the Bruins topping CAL 12-2. Ballard took a 4-0 lead during the first inning and never looked back. Nathan King and Jackson Watkins pitched in the contest. The offense showed life with hits from King, Bradey Moad, Hayden Peck, Cameron Combs and Parker Price. Moad proved strong with a triple and a stolen base. King and Eli Deming earned the only 2 RBI's. The Centurions struggled to score, however, by leaving 8 runners on base.

On Thursday, CAL welcomed Pleasure Ridge Park.

Tanor Fentress pitched a one hit game to shut out the Centurions. Alex Ullom achieved the sole hit. Eli Deming and Alex Yarberry pitched for Christian Academy. The only defensive spark came from a double play by Cameron Combs and Jackson Watkins. The Panthers were victorious 12-0.



Saturday took the Centurions on a road trip to play Lexington Catholic, where their luck finally changed. Drew Harned pitched the first five innings for CAL, with relief from Nolan Wahl and Alex Yarberry. In the second inning, Eli Deming started the offense with a line drive double, followed by hits from Cameron Combs and Parker Price. Deming and Combs would eventually score, giving the Centurions a 2-0 lead. In the fourth, Alex Ullom and Jackson Watkins hit back-to-back doubles, followed by walks from Bradey Moad and Nathan King. With bases loaded, Alex Yarberry hit a line drive double to left field, knocking in two more runs. Two innings later, Watkins and Moad reached base on walks, with Yarberry once again knocking in two runs with a line drive.

With an 81% strike percentage, Harned was able to limit the Knights scoring until the sixth inning, when they took an 8-7 lead. Not to be deterred, the Centurions started the last inning off strong with a hit by Wahl and eventual steal of second. Ullom bunted and Wahl scored on the throw to tie the game. Watkins hit a ground ball to third base before Moad blasted a line drive triple to center field, giving the Centurions a 10-8 lead. King knocked Moad in with a deep line drive double that one-hopped the left field fence. Fly balls caught by Yarberry and Patrick Snider, as well as a strikeout by Yarberry kept the Knights from scoring in the bottom of the inning, leaving CAL on top 11-8. This game marked the most hits of the season for the Freshmen team with 16. Yarberry earned 4 of the Centurions 10 RBI's. Combs, Moad, Ullom, Wahl and Watkins stole bases to assist with the high scoring victory. The Freshmen have two road games next week against Trinity and North Oldham.

The Christian Academy Middle School Softball Team kicked off the 2021 season this past week, after several weeks of pre-season practice. Playing four games, the Lady Centurions began their season with some tough competition and showed great resilience, never giving up and terrific effort and

improvement:

- GAME 1: Tuesday April 13 vs Frankfort Middle School Varsity -- The first game of the year saw the team travel to Capital View Park in Frankfort to face the Varsity Frankfort Middle School Team. It was a quick game, with the Frankfort pitcher tossing a three-inning no-hitter and winning 17-0.

- GAME 2: The Lady Centurions kept their heads up after facing a very good Frankfort Middle School Varsity team, and jumped out to a 12-0 first inning lead. 8th grade pitcher and lead off batter Makenzie King kicked things off with single, followed by a double by shortstop Annabelle Miller and another single by third baseman Kayla Harned that drove in the first two runs. Candice Smith smacked a double to left-center and Gabby Deming ripped a single right center field brining in Maggie Holt and Taylor Mattingly who had also reached base previously. Sadie Heuke hit a two-out single at the bottom of the order that led to four straight singles by King, Miller, Harned and Jayonna Collins to cap off the 12-run first.

Makenzie King struck out the first two hitters at the bottom of the first inning, as well as the fifth Frankfort batter to get all three outs that inning for CAL.

CAL came out strong early in the second inning with another 5 hits and putting 5 runs on the scoreboard. King struck out two more batters in the bottom of the second, and Harned made a fine play at third base to end the inning and the ballgame with the run rule -- CAL wins 17-6.

- GAME 3: The first home game of the season saw Shelby County visiting the English Station campus, and a tight, competitive game. Makenize King once again took to the pitching mound for CAL, and pitched very well; but the CAL defense was a little jittery giving up 6 first inning runs. CAL settled in for the second inning after allowing only two runs, and came out swinging with catcher Maggie Holt driving in two runs with a triple to right center. King shut down the Shelby County batting order in the top of the third facing four batters, striking out two and getting the final out on a short infield fly ball. CAL came back in the third scoring two more runs highlighted by an Annabelle Miller double. Shelby County put three more runs on the board at the top of the 4th, and shut down CAL as the game ended 11-4 Shelby County.

- GAME 4: For the final game of week one, CAL traveled to Kentucky Country Day with Annabelle Miller pitching the first game of her CAL Middle School career. CAL experienced some first inning offensive and defensive jitters, allowing KCD to jump out to a quick 5-0 lead. Things settled down to start the second inning, with Jayonna Collins leading off with a strong single up the middle, then a couple of batters later Taylor Mattingly drove Collins in with a single. CAL scored 2 in the second inning, and Miller pitched her best inning striking out the first batter she face, then getting great defensive support to shut down the side.

CAL held KCD to only three runs the rest of the game, and carved out four more runs but came up short with the time limit to fall to the Bearcats 8-6.
