# CAL Baseball is KY 2A State Championship Runner-Up!

The Christian Academy Louisville Baseball Centurions are the KHSAA 2021 Kentucky 2A Championship baseball runner-up!



CAL lost to undefeated Paducah Tilghman, 10-7, on

Sunday afternoon in Owensboro in a tightly contested championship game that developed into a slugfest in the sixth inning.

Paducah Tilghman pushed across a first inning run to take a 1-0 lead before CAL tied the game in the third inning. Johnny Pohlman opened the Centurions' third inning with a sharp single to left field. One out later, Logan McNair lined a single to center field with Pohlman stopping at second base. Avery Hare was hit by a pitch to load the bases and Pohlman scored one out later when Jack Mauzy drew a bases loaded walk to tie the game.



Tilghman scored single runs in the third and fourth innings to take a 3-1 lead before CAL narrowed the margin with a single tally in the fifth inning. Hare opened the in-

ning with a infield single and advanced to second two outs later on a passed ball before scoring when Marshall Mowder grounded a single into centerfield.

CAL took a 6-3 lead with a four-run sixth inning. With one out, Pohlman and Jack Perdue both singled and McNair drew a walk to load the bases. Pohlman tied the game when Hare reached on an infield single. One




However, the lead didn't last long. Tilghman sent 11 men to the plate in the sixth inning, scoring seven runs on only three hits, taking advantage of two CAL errors, two hit batsmen, and a walk to take a 10-6 lead that the Centurions could not overcome.




CAL did score once more in the game. Pohlman collected his third hit of the game with a one-out single before advancing to second one-out later on a wild pitch. McNair drove him home with a ground ball single into right field, but the late game excitement ended there.


CAL rapped out twelve hits in the game. Pohlman was 3-3 with three singles and a walk and Avery Hare had three singles in the game. Jack Perdue, Logan McNair, and Marshall Mowder all singled twice. Nathaniel Turner started on the mound for the Centurions, going five innings. Turner had relief help from Ben Kirk, Noah McCarty, and Will Thompson. Jack Mauzy made an outstanding running catch on a line drive in centerfield to end a fourth inning rally by Tilghman.

Three Centurions were named to the All-Tournament team: Avery Hare, Marshall Mowder, and Johnny Pohlman.










In the opening round quarterfinals of the state tournament, Jacob Price went the distance on the mound, allowing four hits and no earned runs, while striking out 10 batters and walking none as CAL defeated Bardstown, 4-1.

Bardstown scored one unearned run in the top of the first inning with no outs to take an early lead on CAL. However, the Centurions quickly scored two runs of their own in the home half of the first inning to take a 2-1 lead, a lead CAL would not relinquish.

Jett Peterson was hit by a pitch to open the inning and was sacrificed to second base on a bunt by Logan McNair. Avery Hare sin-

gled to left to score Peterson and tie the game at 1-1. Hare moved to second base on a ground ball and scored when the shortstop overthrew the first baseman on Adam Ballard's groundball to give CAL a 2-1 lead.

CAL scored their other two runs in the fourth inning. Adam Ballard drew a one-out walk and advanced to second base on a passed ball. Ballard scored when Marshall Mowder lined a single to right field. Mowder then scored when Jacob Price reached on a three-base throwing error by the third baseman.





CAL had only three hits in the game, all singles, but made them count. Marshall Mowder had two singles and Avery Hare singled once. As mentioned, Jacob Price went the distance on the mound to earn the victory for the Centurions as CAL advanced to the semi-finals of the inaugural 2021 Kentucky 2A Championships.

In the semi-finals on Saturday, CAL played until after midnight in the Central time zone on a rain-soaked, foggy field in Owensboro, overcoming a 5-2 deficit to defeat Warren East, 7-6, in walk-off fashion. The fog in the outfield gave an eerie presence which only added to the excitement of the game as fans in the stands were struggling to even see the outfielders in the late innings.

The game was tied at 6-6 as CAL came to bat in the bottom of the seventh inning when Jack Perdue reached third base on a three-base infield error with two outs. Sam Zeller entered the game to courtesy run for the pitcher Perdue and scored on the first pitch to Jack Mauzy sailed by the catcher allowing Zeller to score the winning walk-off run from third base.



CAL had tied the game in the bottom of the sixth. Trailing Warren East, 6-4, Johnny Pohlman lined a single to right field with one out. Pohlman was forced out at second base on a Jett Peterson fielder's choice ground ball before Logan McNair doubled down the right field line with Peterson stopping at third base. Peterson and McNair both scored to tie the game when Avery Hare reached on a third base throwing error.








One out later, McNair advanced to third base on a passed ball and scored the game's first run when Adam Ballard grounded a single into right field.

CAL"s second run came in the second inning. Jack Mauzy singled to centerfield and stole second base and was sacrificed to third by Johnny Pohlman before scoring on a Jett Peterson infield single, giving CAL a 2-0 lead.





CAL scored twice in the bottom of the fifth. Hare walked with one out before Jacob Price hit into a force play at second base. Adam Ballard reached base on a dropped third strike with Price moving to second. Price scored on Marshall Mowder's single to centerfield with Ballard advancing to third base. Ballard scored on a wild pitch to narrow the game to 5-4. Warren East added a run in the top of the sixth to extend the lead to 6-4 setting up CAL's late inning heroics.

CAL had ten hits in the game. Adam Ballard and Marshall Mowder both singled twice and Logan McNair doubled. Also singling were Jett Peterson, Avery Hare, Landon Mullaney, Jack Mauzy, and Johnny Pohlman. Jack Perdue was the winning pitcher in relief of Landon Mullaney. Mullaney started the game and gave the Centurions four innings before Perdue came on to pitch three innings, allowing only one hit and one unearned run while striking out four.



Earlier in the week, CAL played a series of home games, losing one before winning two. In the first game of the week, CAL lost two early leads in a game before succumbing to Holy Cross, 13-7.

CAL took an early first inning 1-0 lead when Jett Peterson lined a single to centerfield to extend his hitting streak to 11 consecutive games for the Centurions. Logan McNair followed with a single to right before Holy Cross mishandled Avery Hare's sacrifice bunt for an error as CAL loaded the bases. Peterson then scored as CAL hit into a double play.

Holy Cross scored twice in the top of the second inning to take a 2-1 margin, before CAL regained the lead in the bottom half of the frame. Marshall Mowder walked, Jack Perdue reached base on an infield single and Noah McCarty sacrifice bunted to give CAL runners on second and third with one out. Jack Mauzy then drove home both Mowder and Perdue on his ground ball single into centerfield. Mauzy advanced to second base on an infield ground out and scored when McNair reached on an infield single, giving CAL a 4-2 lead.

The Centurion lead didn't last for long. Holy Cross used a game total of 14 hits and took advantage of four Centurion walks and five CAL errors to score three runs in the third inning, two in the fourth and five more runs in the sixth to take a 12-4 lead.

CAL scored once in the sixth when Hare reached on an error, advanced to second base on a passed ball, moved to third when Nick Britton reached on an error and scored when Mowder flied out to right field. Holy Cross added a run to extend their lead to 13-6 in the top of the seventh, before CAL answered with one more run in the bottom half of the inning to account for the final score. CAL's seventh run scored when Johnny Pohlman blooped a double into centerfield and scored when Jack Mauzy lined a double into rightfield.

CAL had seven hits in the game; Jack Mauzy had a double and single, while Logan McNair had two singles, and Johnny Pohlman a double. Jett Peterson and Jack Perdue each singled. Landon Mullaney and Will Thompson handled mound duties for the Centurions.



On Tuesday night, CAL plated five runs with two outs in the second inning and coasted to a 9-1 win over district rival Kentucky Country Day.

Nick Britton started the second inning rally for the Centurions with a line drive single to right field. Matthew Mowder walked to give CAL runners on first and second with one out. One out later, Johnny Pohlman grounded to third base, but a throwing error allowed Britton and Mowder to score with Pohlman reaching second base safely. Pohlman advanced to third on a wild pitch and scored when Jack Mauzy reached first safely on an infield single to shortstop. Mauzy stole second base and scored when Jett Peterson singled sharply to left field extending Peterson's hitting streak to 12 consecutive games. Peterson ran all the way to third base as the ball got by KCD's left fielder and scored when Logan McNair reached safely on an error by the third baseman, giving CAL a 5-0 lead.

KCD scored their only run in the third inning before CAL pushed across two more runs in the fifth and two more in the sixth. In the fifth inning, Avery Hare grounded a first pitch double down the left field line and advanced to third base when Ben Kirk lined a double to left. Both runners scored when Britton grounded a single into right field.

CAL's final two runs came in the sixth. Braeden Davis singled on a line drive to centerfield and Jager Carter was hit by a pitch. Kirk hit into a fielder's choice with Davis advancing to third base and Kirk at first with one out. Phillip Fetter singled to centerfield to score Davis. Kirk scored when Marshall Mowder hit into a fielder's choice at second base, but the second baseman's throw to first was errant allowing Kirk to score CAL's ninth and final run.

CAL collected ten hits in the game with eight different players entering the hit column. Jack Mauzy and Nick Britton both singled twice while Avery Hare and Ben Kirk each doubled. Jett Peterson, Braeden Davis, Phillip Fetter, and Marshall Mowder all singled.



CAL shined on the mound with four pitchers combining in only allowing five hits and one run. Jack Perdue was the winning pitcher, going four innings and allowing one run. Adam Ballard, Marshall Mowder, and Avery Hare all pitched one inning in relief to close the game for the Centurions.

Senior Night highlighted the CAL Thursday affair as the Centurions topped Portland Christian, 13-1, honoring CAL's eight seniors: Jager Carter, Braeden Davis, Phillip Fetter, Ben Kirk, Jack Maury, Marshall Mowder, Landon Mullaney, and John Pohlman.

The contest was decided early as CAL scored five times in the bottom of the first inning, thrice in the second, one in the third, and four times in the fourth inning. Portland Christian's only run scored in the top of the fifth inning.

John Pohlman drew a one-out walk and scored on Marshall Mowder's triple to right field. Landon Mullaney walked and stole second base, advancing to third while Mowder scored on the pitcher's wild pitch to the plate. One out later, Braeden Davis drew a walk with Sam Zeller courtesy running for the catcher Davis. Mullaney and Zeller scored on Phillip Fetter's ground ball single to cen-

ter giving CAL a 5-0 lead.

CAL extended their lead to 8-0 in the second inning. Jack Mauzy led off the inning with an inside the park home run on a line drive to centerfield. One out later, Marshall Mowder walked and stole second base. Landon Mullaney reached on an error when the catcher dropped a pop fly in the infield. Ben Kirk walked to load the bases with Logan McNair courtesy running for the pitcher Kirk. CAL drew two more walks, giving them three consecutive bases on balls, this time to Davis and Fetter to force in two runs with CAL now leading 8-0.

CAL scored once in the third. Johnny Pohlman lined a single to center with one out and consecutive infield singles by Marshall Mowder and Landon Mullaney loaded the bases for CAL. After a fielder's choice at the plate resulted in an out, Mowder scored when Davis's fly ball was dropped by the leftfielder.

CAL scored their final four runs in the fourth inning, all with two outs. Mauzy lined a single to left field and Pohlman reached second base on an infield hit. Mowder reached on an error to load the bases. Mauzy and Pohlman scored when Mullaney lined a singled into centerfield with Mowder stopping at third and Mullaney advancing to second base on play at the plate. Ben Kirk



doubled home both Mowder and Mullaney to provide the final 13-1 margin.

Four different CAL hitters collected two hits on the day. Jack Mauzy homered and singled with John Pohlman, Landon Mullaney, and Marshall Mowder all collecting two singles. Jager Carter and Ben Kirk both doubled and Phillip Fetter singled. Mowder scored four runs in the game while Fetter had three runs batted in.

Ben Kirk was the starting and winning pitcher for the Centurions, allowing only one hit and no runs, while striking out nine over four innings on the mound. Phillip Fetter recorded the final three outs for CAL.

CAL play district and local rival games this upcoming week. The Centurions play at Eastern High School on Monday at 5:00 then host Eastern on Tuesday at 5:00. CAL travels to DeSales for a game on Thursday at 6:00 before hosting Ballard on a Friday Oaks Day game at 10:30 in the morning. CAL then travels to Jeffersontown's Skyview Park on Monday to play the Christian Education Consortium (CEC) at 5:00 P.M. CAL's record is now 10-8.

# JV Baseball Pulls off Upset at Trinity






Moad and Noah McCarty reached base by walks, then scored on a line









# Freshmen Centurions Split Week with Loss to Trinity and Win at North Oldham
