#### **Centurions Baseball Split Shut Outs**

With rain leading to the cancellations of two road games last week, the Christian Academy Louisville Centurion baseball team split shutouts in the two games played. CAL lost to South Oldham, 7-0, on Thursday before shutting out Fairdale, 11-0, on Saturday.



On Saturday, Ben Kirk allowed only four hits in five innings with Phillip Fetter pitching a scoreless sixth inning as the Centurions defeated Fairdale, 11-0, at Fairdale High School.


Avery Hare led off the CAL second inning with a line drive single to centerfield and promptly stole second base. Hare scored when Nick Britton lined a double to left field. Two outs later, Britton scored when Jack Perdue lined a single to

left field. Hare also led off the next CAL scoring rally when he doubled to left field to lead off the fourth inning. Hare scored one out later when Noah

McCarty grounded a single into right field. Jack Mauzy sacrifice bunted

with McCarty advancing all the way to third base. Perdue collected his second RBI of the game when he lined a single to right field so score McCarty. Perdue stole second base and scored when Ben Kirk grounded a single into left field to give CAL a 5-0 lead.

The Centurions' offense exploded for six runs in the sixth inning. McCarty led off the inning with a walk, stole second base, and scored when Mauzy singled to centerfield. Perdue reached on an error with Mauzy advancing to second base. Both runners moved up a base on a wild pitch and both scored when Kirk lined a single into centerfield. Jett Peterson lined a single to left with Kirk stopping at second base. Both runners scored when Jacob Price lined a double to the base of the centerfield wall. Johnny Pohlman reached on infield single with Price scoring as the shortstop's throw sailed by the first baseman, giving CAL their final 11-0 margin.



CAL had 12 hits in the game. Avery Hare had a double and a single with Jack Perdue and Ben Kirk both had two singles. Jacob Price and Nick Britton both doubled while Jett Peterson, John Pohlman, Noah McCarty, and Jack Mauzy all singled once.

As mentioned, winning pitcher Ben Kirk threw five shutout innings, walking two and striking out five. Phillip Fetter threw a scoreless sixth inning, striking out three Fairdale batters. This was the fourth shutout by Centurion pitchers this season.

On Thursday, South Oldham scored three runs in the bottom of the first inning to take an early 3-0 lead then held Centurion hitters to only four singles in the game in defeating CAL, 7-0. This game was the first time the Centurions had been shut out this season.

South Oldham scored three runs in the first inning, one run in the third, one in the fifth, and two runs in the sixth inning.

Jack Perdue had two singles for CAL with Avery Hare and John Pohlman both singling once. Jacob Price pitched his fifth complete game of the year on the mound for the Centurions.

CAL is now 13-10 on the season. The Centurions are scheduled to play five games in the upcoming week, a mix of home and road games. On Monday, CAL traveled to Bullitt East for a 6:00 game before hosting Pleasure Ridge Park on Tuesday at 5:30. CAL plays at top-ranked Trinity on Thursday at 6:30 before hosting a rematch with DeSales on Friday at 6:00. CAL plays at Butler High School on Saturday at 4:00. CAL will begin the next week by hosting Oldham County on Monday at 6:00 The two games rained out this past week were versus Christian Education Consortium (CEC) and Male.


