

CAL BASEBALL PREPARES FOR POSTSEASON

The Christian Academy Louisville baseball team split four games this past week as they prepare to begin district tournament play on Saturday, May 29.



The week began with a dramatic walk-off victory as CAL overcame an early 5-0 deficit to defeat 17th ranked Oldham County in extra innings, 7-6.

With the game tied at 6-6 in the middle of the eighth, home team CAL's inning began when Jack Perdue reached first base on an infield single.





field with Mowder stopping at second base. Mauzy re-entered the game to run for Mullaney. Mowder scored and Mauzy advanced to third base when Jett Peterson reached on an infield error. Mauzy scored on a wild pitch with Peterson moving to second base. Nick Britton walked and both runners advanced on a Noah McCarty ground out. CAL then tied the game when Johnny Pohlman lined a single to leftfield scoring both Peterson and Britton.

Oldham County opened a large early game lead by scoring five runs in the top half of the second inning. CAL countered with two runs in the bottom half of the second. Perdue reached on an error to open the inning and advanced to second base on a Mowder single to right field. Kirk sacrificed, advancing both runners. Perdue and Mowder scored CAL's first two runs when Peterson lined a double to centerfield. Oldham County scored their sixth run in the fifth inning setting the stage for CAL's late game heroics.



CAL had nine hits in the game: two singles each by Marshall Mowder and John Pohlman, a double by Jett Peterson, and singles by Landon Mullaney, Jack Mauzy, Noah McCarty, and Nick Britton. Jack Perdue went the distance on the mound for the Centurions, pitching eight innings and allowing six hits while striking out eight.

On Tuesday, CAL played #9 ranked St. Xavier at home and collected ten hits, but fell behind early before falling, 7-1.

St. Xavier scored once in the second inning, four in third, and twice in the sixth to take a 7-0 lead before CAL dented the scoreboard in the bottom half of the sixth. Marshall Mowder singled to centerfield with one out before Jacob Price hit into a force play at second base. Price advanced to second base on a passed ball with Noah McCarty entering the game to run for Price. Jack Perdue reached on an infield error with McCarty moving to third. McCarty scored CAL's only run when Avery Hare reached on an infield error.

CAL loaded the bases again in the seventh inning, but the rally faded before scoring. Besides their run, CAL had three runners reach third base and left the bases loaded twice, leaving 11 runners on base in the game.

John Pohlman, Marshall Mowder, and Jack Perdue all singled twice in the game for CAL and Jacob Price doubled. Ben Kirk, Landon Mullaney, and Nick Britton all singled once. Jacob Price started on the mound for CAL and pitched six innings with Noah McCarty pitching the seventh inning in relief.



On Thursday at duPont Manual, the game was pretty much a reversal of Monday's game, with duPont Manual overcoming a 4-1 deficit to defeat CAL, 8-6.

CAL scored twice in the first inning. Nick Britton and Avery Hare were both hit by pitches and advanced to third and second, respectively, on wild pitches. Britton scored on a Marshall Mowder sacrifice fly and Hare scored on the same play on an errant throw by the right fielder.

CAL upped their lead to 3-0 in the top half of the second inning. Logan McNair led off the inning with a line drive single to left field and was balked to second base. McNair advanced to third on a Bradey Moad fly out to right field and scored on Britton's ground ball single to center field.

duPont Manual scored once in the bottom of the second inning before CAL scored again in the top of the third. Mowder singled to right with one out and advanced to third base one out later when Jack Perdue reached on an infield single. Mowder stole home to score CAL's fourth run of the game on a successful CAL double steal with Perdue nabbing second base on the play.


CAL held the 4-1 lead into the fifth inning as Centurion starting pitcher Nathaniel Turner had held duPont Manual hitless through four innings. However, duPont Manual erupted for six runs in the fifth inning to take a 7-4 lead. duPont Manual scored once in the sixth to extend their lead to 8-4 before CAL began another seventh inning rally.

Britton walked with one out and Noah McCarty doubled to left with Britton stopping at third. Hare singled to left with Britton scoring and McCarty advancing to third. Mowder hit into a fielder's choice to score McCarty but the game ended when Jacob Price flied out to deep center field.

CAL had eight hits in the game, led by Noah McCarty's double and single. Jacob Price doubled and Nick Britton, Avery Hare, Marshall Mowder, Jack Perdue, and Logan McNair all singled. Nathaniel Turner started on the mound and pitched five innings and Will Thompson pitched the final inning in relief.

CAL played their third home game of the week on Saturday. CAL spotted Spencer County three runs in the top of the first inning before coming back to win, 11-8. CAL scored three runs in the bottom of the first and three more in the second to take a 6-3 lead before coasting to the win.

Nick Britton opened the CAL half of the first with a base on balls, the first of his three walks in the game. One out later, Johnny Pohlman reached on an infield error with Britton stopping at second. Both scored one out later when Jack Perdue lined a triple to right centerfield, cutting the Spencer County lead to 3-2. Jacob Price drew a walk and Perdue scored when Landon Mullaney grounded a single into centerfield to tie the score.



The Centurions took the lead for good with a three run second. Britton tripled to left field with one out and Noah McCarty walked. Both scored when Pohlman lined a double to right field. Pohlman advanced to third base on a wild pitch and scored on Marshall Mowder's sacrifice fly to give CAL a 6-3 lead.


CAL scored twice more in the third. Mullaney walked to lead off the inning with Avery Hare courtesy running for the pitcher Mullaney. Hare ad-

vanced to second base on Jack Mauzy's sacrifice bunt and scored when Jett Peterson tripled to centerfield, CAL's third triple of the game. Britton walked and promptly stole second base. Peterson scored on a wild pitch, stretching CAL's lead to 8-3.

Spencer County tallied a run in the top of the fourth inning, but CAL answered with a run of their own in the bottom half of the frame. Perdue, Logan McNair, and Ben Kirk all walked with one out to load the bases. Perdue scored on a Mauzy sacrifice fly, giving CAL a 9-4 lead.



Spencer narrowed the lead to 9-7 in the fifth inning by scoring three runs, but CAL answered with two insurance runs in the bottom half of the inning. Britton again walked to lead off the inning and scored when the Spencer County pitcher threw Avery Hare's sacrifice bunt down the right field line with Hare running all the way to third base. Hare later scored on a wild pitch giving CAL an 11-7 lead. Spencer County scored once more in the seventh to account for the final 11-8 score.



CAL had seven hits in the game, four for extra bases while drawing nine walks. Nick Britton reached base four times on a triple and three walks. Jeff Peterson and Jack Perdue both had a triple and a single, and John Pohlman doubled. Landon Mullaney added a single. Will Thompson was the winning pitcher allowing one hit in 2 1/3 innings of relief. Landon Mullaney started the game on the mound and Ben Kirk also relieved.

Christian Academy plays the last week of their regular season at home. The Centurions host South Oldham Monday night at 6 p.m. before hosting Fairdale on Tuesday at 5. Butler visits CAL on Thursday at 6:00 for CAL's final game of the regular season. The Centurions currently carry a 15-17 record.

The 28th District tournament begins on Saturday with CAL playing Eastern High School at Eastern High School at Eastern High School at 2:30. The district tournament final will be played Monday, May 31, at 2:00 at Eastern High School against the winner of the Ballard-Kentucky Country Day game. Both district tournament finalists advance to the regional tournament which will be played at Spalding University's Derby City Field on June 5, 7, and 8th. The KHSAA state tournament will be played at Whitaker Bank Field in Lexington.




