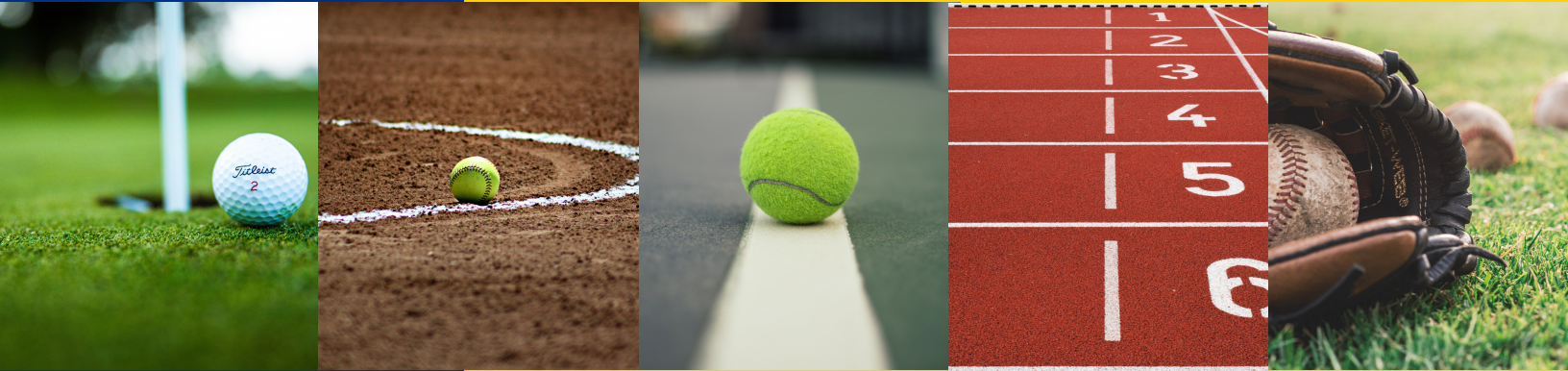

Though the Warriors lost (9-1), some Warriors had a good day on the diamond. At the plate, Grace Mullins went 3-4 with the lone run scored and Loran Palmer went 2-3. Josie Leffler also had a nice base hit up the 3rd base line, which scored the lone Warrior RBI. On Friday, the New Washington Mustangs came to CAL in a close contest, despite the threat of rain and dropping temps. Ultimately, the Warriors came up short (7-2) but saw great improvements. The Warriors threatened numerous times throughout the game, stranding 13 runners. Selene Morgan showed patience at the plate, earning three walks in her four plate appearances. Grace Mullins (3-4 with an RBI double) and Loran Palmer (2-4) again led the way offensively. The outfielders were busy tracking down balls that were being controlled by the strong winds. Haley Jones had three putouts and was part of a double play. Brooklyn Shields was a wall behind the plate, and also helped catch two runners stealing. Grace Mullins had 8 strikeouts, only five walks and had a gem of an inning in the 4th, when she struck out the side. The co-ed freshmen 4x100m team of Audrey Brieschke, Kaleb Nicholson, Nora Stocksdale and Ben Rehnberg finished as runners-up, and the co-ed freshmen 4x400m team of Audrey, Nora, Mason Taylor and Alexander Pinckney had a come from behind victory in their race.
