Two one act shows with an intermission between. Tickets get you into both shows.

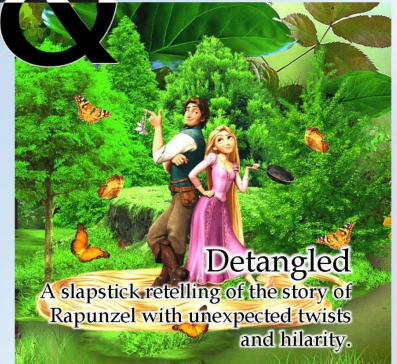

We are excited to announce that we are relaunching our CAI international mission trips for 2022. The trips being planned are:

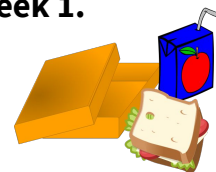
Honduras - Spring Break - open to students in grades 9-12

Chapel Day Dress Code

Elementary

- Girls-Jumper, skirt, or skort worn with a white collared blouse or approved uniform dress. Navy or white cardigan or navy crew or v-neck sweaters may be worn in cold weather.
- Boys-Khaki or navy uniform pants or shorts with white or light blue oxford shirt and solid navy, gold or approved plaid tie or bowtie are required. Navy cardigan, crew, v-neck sweaters may be worn in cold weather.
- Approved sweatshirts and quarter-zip pullovers may not be worn to chapel.**

High School/Middle School

Long pants or skirts (no shorts), and a logo button-down oxford or blouse (no polos, sweatshirts, or athletic wear.) Logo sweaters are also permitted. Boys are to wear a tie.
