

Individual 2A State champion was Matthew Troutman shooting a 3 under par score, birding two of the last three holes. Brady Smith was runner-up shooting a 2 under. CAL competed at a high level in wet and windy conditions.





Several minutes later Andres took an elbow to the neck and was down on the turf deep on the offensive side. While her teammates signaled that their leader was down, play continued and Providence continued to press down the field and scored, cutting CALs lead to 4-3 with a few minutes to play. A minute later Andres returned to play and helped the Centurions hold off a frantic Providence effort to even the score, sealing a hard fought win. Final score: CAL 4, Providence 3.



The CAL 7th and 8th grade football Centurions played MCM Shelbyville on the evening of September 21, finally getting back to our home field. It was an impressive display by the


offense and defense taking CAL to a perfect 5 - 0 record this season.


