VARSIITY CROSS COUNTRY

On Tuesday evening, the Warriors raced at the Silver Creek Invitational. In the boys race, Alex Pinckney took a commanding lead in the first mile and extended that lead throughout the race to cruise to a first place finish in an impressive time of 16:28 on a hilly and challenging course. Mason Taylor had his best race of his high school career as he set a personal record time of 20:00. The impressive finish by the boys team led the team to a sixth place finish among 16 teams!

In the girls race, Anna Nash continued her stellar freshman season by medaling in the top 25 with an impressive eighteenth place finish and a time of 22:38.

At Saturday's Lincoln Trail, Invite, four runners raced to all time personal records at one of the most challenging courses they have faced this year! In the boys race, Alex Pinckney broke 16 minutes by running 15:59 for an impressive 3rd place finish. Mason Taylor improved his best time substantially by running the course in 19:26. Elijah Veihi also ran this very hilly course in his fastest time ever with a finishing time of 27:20.
