### VARSITY CROSS COUNTRY

The Warriors kicked off their season with awesome performances at the Silver Creek Hokum Karem. This meet is a two-person relay race where each participant runs three times for one mile. It was a rainy day, making for nice temperatures yet muddy conditions.

The top finishers for the boys was the pair of Alex Pinckney and Nathan Tucker competed well and earned a medal with a 4th place finish. On the girls side, the top finishers for the Warriors was the pairing of Anna Nash and Maddie Smith who completed the race in 13th place.

On Saturday, the team ran their first full 5K race of the season at the Rick Weinheimer XC Classic in Columbus. It was a huge meet with 49 different teams from all over the state.

In the boy's race, Alex Pinckney led the way for the Warriors as he placed third overall for Class A schools. His personal record time of 16:01 was also good enough for a 15th place overall among all classes.

In the girl's race, Freshman Warrior Anna Nash led the team with a terrific time of 21:54 for her first ever HS 5K race. That time earned her a 38th place finish among all Class A schools
