

# Elementary Uniform Dress Code Reminders: With cooler weather approaching, please remember these dress code guidelines.

- Shoes-Standard athletic/tennis shoes should be worn with socks visible above the shoe. Solid navy, black, or brown dress shoes may be worn on chapel days but are not required. If students have P.E. on chapel day, they will need to bring tennis shoes and socks. Dress shoes are not permitted on the gym floor. Not Permitted: Wheelie shoes, boots, backless shoes, platform shoes, sandals, clogs, or slip-on shoes.
- Socks, tights or leggings-Solid navy, black, or white socks, tights or ankle length leggings may be worn. Socks should be visible above the shoe.
- If a long sleeve shirt is worn under a short sleeve shirt, it must be white or navy.

**Land's End School Uniform Starboard Scholarship-**Calling all student leaders. We're excited to announce our 2021-2022 scholarship program is open for entries. Since 2019, we've awarded 19 scholarships—a total of \$165,000—to students who have shown exceptional leadership skills.
