Up and coming freshman runner Megan Wearsch finished 68th in a time of 22:12. Senior Leah Moylan finished her CAL career in 116th in a time of 23:10. Finally Freshman Skylar Greenwell finished her strong freshman season with a 127th finish in a respectable 23:24. A total of 219 runners ran in the race. Lexington Catholic took home the team Honors in the Class 2A division.



The CAL Boys improved on their 12th place 2020 finish by finishing in 10th place in 2021!

The team was led again by Senior Tommy Ott who finished 16th in a time of 17:06. Completing a strong Freshman campaign was Samuel Herbig in 28th place in a time of 17:47. Next was Sophomore Josh Schroering in 88th place in a time

of 18:55. Finishing 4th-7th on the team were the pack of Juniors, Joshua Jordan 97th in 19:01, Carson Guilford 100th in 19:06, Matt Rosenbaum 129th in 19:30, and Andrew Lampe 166th in 20:15. A total of 243 runners competed individually for the state championship. North Oldham repeated as State Champion of the Class 2A division.

The team would like to thank Lowery Stallings who was a late preseason replacement after the previous coach departed for an out of state college coaching position. The team experienced a lot of success and the future is bright for both teams looking into 2022.

1st Quarter - The Colonels kicked off to start the game and immediately recovered a CAL fumble taking over on their own 49-yard line. They managed to run for a first down but CAL forces a turn over on downs. CAL starts their drive on their 34-yard line and Jeffery Vazzana (#2) busts a run for a gain of 8 yards. Colin Daniels (#8) then throws a pass to Micah Akin (#11) for the first down. Daniels hits Akin for another huge 3rd down conversion on the next series moving the ball to the Colonel's 28-yard line. A quarterback sack on the next play makes it 2nd and 22 yards. The quarter ends with a Daniels to Akin pass for 14 yards. Score 0 - 0.



2nd Quarter - CAL faced a 4th and 7 on the opening drive of the second quarter when Daniels throws a pass in the flats to Vazzana who runs in from 20 yards for a touchdown! Madden Miller (#9) kicks the extra point and CAL leads 7-0. Miller kicks off and the Colonels start with the ball on their own 25-yard line. The Colonels make a first down on relatively short runs due to great back-to-back tackles by Eli Bednark (#58). They make another first down with a pass completion and seemed to be finding some offensive rhythm. Cooper May (#30) then makes a great tackle for no gain and CAL's defense forces a fumble on the next play recovered by Nolan Flores (#34). Great stop defense!!

CAL's offense takes over on their own 44-yard line and starts the drive with a nice pass from Daniels to Chapman Russell (#4) for a first down. The drive however, stalls with a turnover on downs but the Colonels cannot move the ball due to a Vazzana tackle on first down followed by tackle for loss by Stone Perkins (#21) and a huge quarterback sack by Akin. The quarter ends with the half time score 7 - 0 CAL.

3rd Quarter - CAL kicks off to open the second half and the defense came out ready to play. Joe Green (#22) set the early tone by making a tackle for a 5 yard loss on the opening play. The Colonels, facing a 4th down and 1 yard, decided to go for it and were stuffed but great team tackling! CAL takes over on the turnover on downs. Vazzana runs for a first down and rambles for 30 yards on the next series moving the ball to the 11 yard line. Perkins runs for 6 yards, Vazzana runs it to the 1-yard line and Daniels runs in for the touchdown on a quarterback keeper. CAL 13 - 0.

CAL kicks off but the Colonels could not move the ball and were forced to punt due to great tackles by Bednark, Akin and a sack for loss by Flores. Russell fielded the punt and makes a great return to mid-field. Vazzana runs for 30 yards and a first down to end the quarter.

4th Quarter - CAL has the ball on the Colonels 22-yard line. Vazzana runs for a first down to the 12-yard line. A penalty pushes CAL back and on 3rd down and 20, Russell runs a reverse for 18 yards. Vazzana follows this with another touchdown run, Miller's extra point good - CAL leads 20 - 0. The Colonels were unable to effectively move the ball for the duration of the 4th quarter which featured some great plays: a) Bednark continuing to make tackles, b) JB Hilliard Jr (#10) and Jax Babin (#33) combining for a quarterback sack and c) Vazzana continuing to run for big chunks of yardage. A great 20 - 0 victory for CAL in the state semi-final game. Onto the State championship game next Saturday November 20th!

Observations: 1) Coach Griffie named Coach of the Year, well deserved with a shout out to the entire coaching staff - great job, 2) great play from offense, defense and special teams winning in impressive style, 3) a wonderful season that will end next week in the State Championship game, and 4) praying with our opponent after the game - yeah Jesus!
