With a tremendous defensive effort (13 steals) the Shields defeated Highlands Latin-Crescent Hill 19-15. Luke porter was truly a Warrior as he had six points and led the way with 10 rebounds and six steals. Cohen Hawkins had a great game as well with eight rebounds and two steals. Harrison Oakley hit a three to get the scoring started, and the Shields' scoring was rounded out with six by James Annis and four by Cameron Busse. Busse sealed the win with the final basket and then came up with a rebound and avoided defensive pressure and dribbled out the clock. The Swords opponent was quarantined on Friday night so their regularly scheduled game didn't happen, but Rock Creek was gracious enough to stay and scrimmage so that our boys could play. Mike Bryant led all scorers with 18 on 75% shooting. Jaxon French gathered 10 rebounds and six points of his own. The Warrior backcourt had a steady game with Cash Crawford and Jake Bibb combining for 12 points, eight rebounds and four assists.

4 BOYS BASKETBALL

The fourth grade Swords traveled to play the host Portland Christian Eagles on Saturday. The Swords were impressive in their opening game. A strong team defense and their ability to control the boards, was a major factor in the fast start. The Swords won 27-3. Xavier Lewis led the Swords with 15 points.
