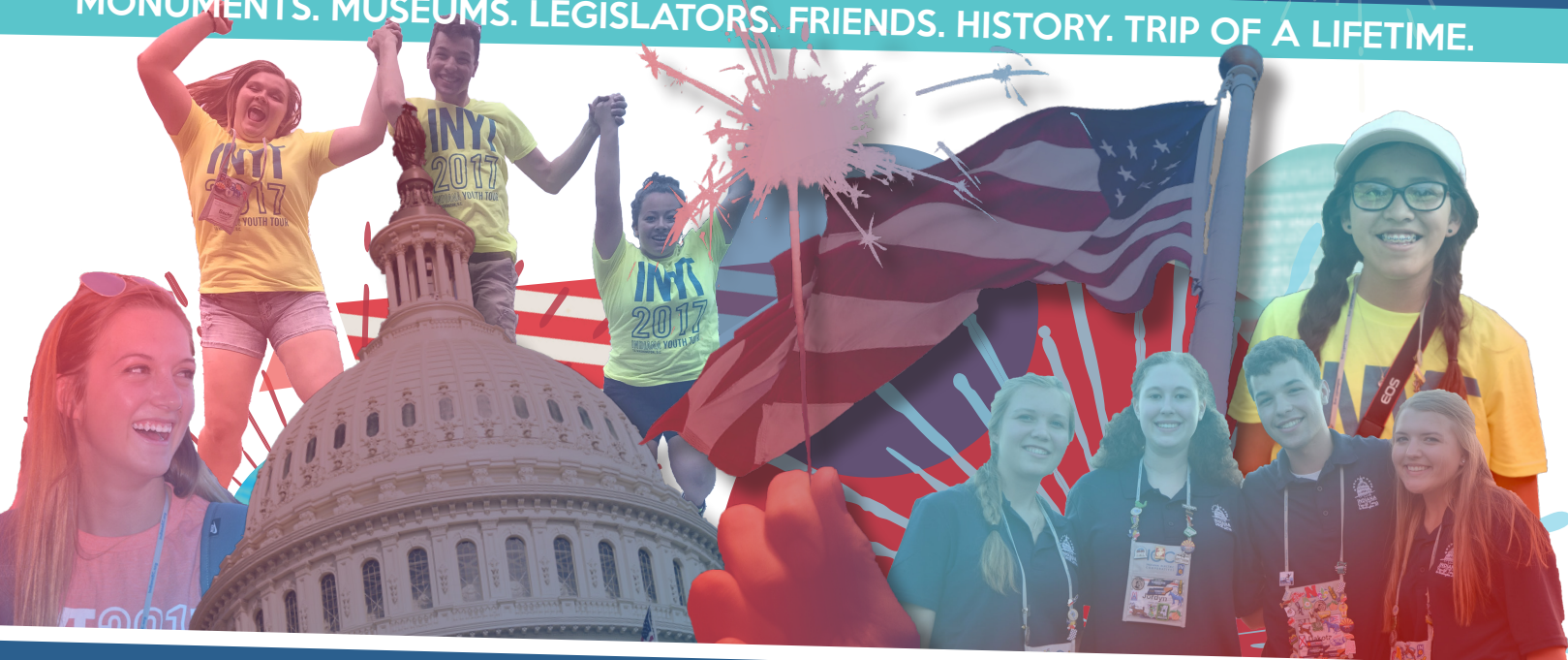

# Class of 2023: Qualify to win \$40,000 just by planning for your future
