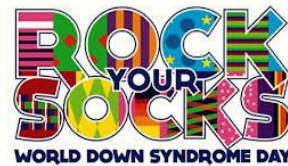

## HS/MS News

It's Career Day! Every other year, we help our high school students start thinking about their career choices. Dr. Chapman did a keynote address for the students, and for the rest of the morning they will attend 4 breakout sessions of their choosing. We have a nurse, engineer, pilot, event planner, realtor, dentist, educator, minister, author, designer, business owner, artist, firefighter, police officer, architect, and more! High school students will then be released at noon to complete a job shadow experience for more in-depth exploration. We pray that our students will be asking questions and thinking about how they can use their passions to glorify God and influence culture through their chosen career.

Next week the MS/HS will be partnering with NEXGEN and St. Elizabeth Women's Homeless Shelter. St. Elizabeth offers shelter, food, and resources to homeless women often-times with children. During the winter season the shelter runs low on resources, so we will be collecting diapers (any size), baby wipes, and hygiene products (shampoo, body wash, lotion, and hand soap) as these resources can radically change the lives of the women and children who are living at St. Elizabeth. The collection will be held next Friday, February 25. Grades 6-12 can bring in a hygiene item to receive a jeans day on that day. Collection boxes will be set up in the main entrance hallway.
