CAL BASEBALL DEFEATS FAIRDALE IN HOME OPENER

The Christian Academy Louisville Centurions erupted for eight runs in the bottom of the first inning en route to winning their home opener over Fairdale, 12-4, Friday evening.



CAL knocked eight hits in the bottom of the first inning. Nick Britton reached by an error to open the inning and then stole second base. One out later, Jett Peterson doubled to right field scoring Britton with the first run of the game. Peterson stole third base

and scored on an infield hit by Avery Hare, who ran all the way to third base on a throwing error. Jack Perdue singled home Hare and then stole second base before scoring on a double by Noah McCarty. Jacob Price lined a single to right to score McCarty and give CAL a 5-0 lead. Ryan Lynch followed with a single

to center, Price stopping at second base. Sam Zeller singled home Price advancing Lynch to second base. Both Zeller and Lynch scored when Britton doubled down the right field line, giving CAL an early 8-0 lead. (continued on next page)

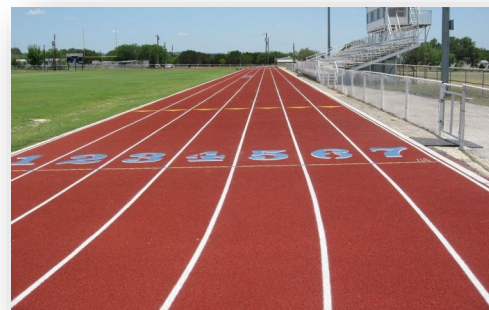

Centurion Track Shows Strong Performances at Opening Outdoor Meet

The boys and girls Centurion track teams started their 2022 outdoor meet season this past Saturday at the Zaxby's Bullskin Relays at

Martha Layne Collins High School. The relay meet offers a variety of relay combinations as well as field events. Under the leadership of first year head coach **Andrew Danner**, the Centurions braved bitter cold, strong wind, and occasional rain showers to compete against 13 other teams from the region. Fairdale tallied their first run in the top of the second inning before CAL answered with two more runs of their own. Avery Hare doubled with one out. One out later, Hare advanced to third base on a wild pitch and scored when Noah McCarty reached on an infield error. McCarty stole second and advanced to third base on a wild pitch. Jacob Price was hit by a pitch. CAL scored their 10th run on a double steal with McCarty stealing home as Price was stealing second base.



CAL extended their lead to 12-1 in the fourth inning. Noah McCarty drew a one-out walk and Bradey Moad and Andrew Gilliam followed with singles to load the bases. McKade Battcher drew a bases loaded walk to score McCarty and Moad scored on a Logan McNair sacrifice fly to finalize CAL scoring.

Fairdale added two runs in the fifth and one run in the sixth to account for the final 12-4 margin.

CAL rapped 11 hits in the game with 10 different Centurions collecting base knocks. Avery Hare two hits, a double and a single to lead the Centurions, while Nicholas Britton, Noah McCarty, and Jett Peterson all doubled. Jack Perdue, Jacob Price, Bradey Moad, Ryan Lynch, Andrew Gilliam, and Sam Zeller all singled. McCarty scored three runs in the game. CAL stole nine bases with Peterson stealing three to lead the way.

On the pitching side, CAL used three pitchers in the game, scattering seven hits while striking out 13. Starting pitcher Michael Lynch struck out six batters in three innings, while winning pitcher Sam Sampson struck out five in 2 1/3 innings. Will Thompson retired all four batters he faced in relief, including a double play.



CAL opened their season on the road Thursday night, falling to North Bullitt, 9-0. North Bullitt took advantage of ten CAL walks and four CAL errors to score three runs in the second, three in the fourth, one in the fifth, and two more in the sixth, despite only collecting three hits in the game.

CAL only had two runners reach third base in the game with four runners caught stealing, three of them trying to steal third base. CAL had three hits, a double by Ryan Lynch and singles by Jett Peterson and Jack Perdue. Nick Britton drew three walks in the game.

Logan McNair logged 3 1/3 innings as the starter for CAL, striking out six. Will Thompson and Jack Perdue both relieved in the game, with Perdue striking out five batters in 2 2/3 innings.

On Saturday, CAL traveled to Lexington on a cool, rainy Saturday afternoon and lost, 6-1, to Paul Laurence Dunbar High School. (continued on next page)

Dunbar scored once in the first inning, two in the second inning, and three more runs in the fifth inning before the Centurions plated their only run. Noah McCarty doubled to left to open the frame and scored on Michael Lynch's line drive single to right field. CAL had no other runners advance past second base.

CAL had five hits in the game: Noah McCarty doubled and singled, Jett Peterson singled twice, and Michael Lynch singled once.



Jacob Price struck out nine batters in 4 1/3 innings for the Centurions and Sam Zeller pitched the final 1 2/3 innings.

CAL starts the season 1-2 and has a full slate of upcoming games. The Centurions play at South Oldham at 5:30 on Monday evening before hosting Oldham County Tuesday night at 6:00. CAL plays at Bullitt Central Friday night at 5:30 and plays at DeSales Saturday at 6:00. CAL begins play in the AA Sectionals on Tuesday, March 29, facing Nelson County High School at Thomas Nelson High School near Bardstown.

The defending 2A state champion girls team placed fourth overall. Sophomore **Ella Daniels** won the high jump clearing the bar at 5'2". Junior **Brianna Isa** took second in the pole vault, clearly 10 feet. Sophomore **Ella Mast** placed second in the 300 meter hurdles with a time of 51.59. Freshman **Maggie Hydes** took fourth in the discus with a throw of 80 feet, 8 inches. Sophomore **Megan Bobnar** leaped to fifth and seventh place finishes in the long jump and triple jump. The girls 4x1600 meter relay team of **Bader, Kelly, Wilkins** and **Moylan** placed fourth in a grueling distance relay. The girls team also earned points in the 4x800 relay (6th), 4x100 (8th), distance medley (6th), and 4x400 (3rd).

The boys team placed 14th overall. The boys team scored points with an 8th place finish in the 4x1600 with a gritty performance of **Joshua Jorden, Samuel Herbig, Luke Stephens**, and **Nathaniel Bryan**. Junior **Carson Guilford** earned a 5th place finish in the high jump, and senior **Matthew Mauzy** earned a point in the discus with a throw of 96 feet.

The boys and girls teams will be back in action Saturday, March 26 at the Oldham County Kick-Off Classic in Buckner, KY.
