

Thompson stole second base and then scored CAL's eighth and final run on a Nick Britton line

drive single to center.



Michael Lynch led the CAL nine-hit attack by going 3-3, with a home run, two singles, and four runs batted in. CAL also had singles from Nick Britton, Jett Peterson, Avery Hare, Logan McNair, Sam Zeller, and Will Thompson. Jack Perdue went the distance on the mound in the victory.

CAL won their third game of the season on Thursday, scoring six runs in the sixth inning to overcome a 5-4 deficit in defeating Bullitt Central, 12-6, in Shepherdsville.

Avery Hare opened the sixth inning with a double down the left field line. Jacob Price drew a walk and both runners advanced on a double steal. Hare scored on a Jack Perdue sacrifice fly with Price advancing to third base. Price scored when Ryan Lynch reached on an error with Lynch scoring when Sam Zeller doubled to centerfield. CAL kicked off the season on Monday by hosting a home opener against the preseason co-favorite in the 7th region, the Assumption Rockets.


