



The offense was powered by three Centurions who had three runs batted in apiece. Leadoff hitter Nick Britton had three doubles in three at bats plus a walk,

Noah McCarty had two doubles, and Jack Perdue homered to centerfield and singled as all drove home three Centurion runners each. Michael Lynch, Jett Peterson, Avery Hare, and Jacob Price also singled.

CAL began their scoring in the bottom of the first inning. Nick Britton lined a double to right on the first pitch and advanced to third base when Michael Lynch popped a single into right field. Lynch

The championship game of the sectional was to be played versus Bardstown High School on Thursday of that week, but was rained out and is yet to be rescheduled. The winner of that game advances to the Kentucky 2A Championships to be played at Owensboro's Shifley Park from April 22-23 in the opening game of the tournament. Game time is scheduled for Friday morning at 10:00 Central time vs. the winner of Section 3. CAL was the overall runner-up in the 2021 tournament to Paducah Tilghman, which is currently ranked as the #1 team in state.

On Friday, CAL lost to Shelby County on the road, 11-4. Starting pitcher Logan McNair held Shelby County scoreless before the Shelby pushed across six runs in the fourth inning to take the lead.

CAL answered with three runs in the top of the fifth inning. Andrew Gilliam lined a single to centerfield to open the inning and advanced to second one-out later when Michael Lynch reached base when the centerfielder dropped his fly ball. Jett Peterson lined a single to right to score Gilliam with Lynch advancing to second base. Avery Hare walked to load the bases. 

CAL BASEBALL ALUMNI AARON BLAKE SETS CAREER SAVES RECORD AT SPALDING UNIVERSITY

EUREKA, Ill. – Spalding University super senior *Aaron Blake* earned his third save of the season in Spalding's 8-6 win over Eureka surpassing Chance Brinley as Spalding's all-time saves leader. The save marks Blake's ninth career save. Spalding also won game one of the series, 8-3, to clinch the series, but were unable to complete the sweep falling to the Red Devils, 2-1, on Monday afternoon. The Eagles are currently sit at 12-10 on the season and 4-2 in conference play.



Game 1: Spalding 8 - Eureka 3

Spalding was able to score early in the first game as *Hunter Strong* started the second inning with a leadoff walk. *Michael Speck* would blast a ball over the fence in dead center to score Strong with a two-run homer. With the Golden Eagles leading by two, Spalding would start a two-out rally in the third as *Eric Bronner*, Strong, and Speck are given free bases to load the base path. *Marcus Collins* would single to right field scoring Strong and Bronner on the hit to give Spalding a 4-0 lead. A throwing error by the Eureka Pitcher would then Speck to add on another run in the third for Spalding. Although the Red Devils scored two in the fifth, Spalding would answer back in the seventh with three runs of their own to extend the lead to 8-2. *Adam Weining* would keep Eureka down to just one run on the mound for Spalding to get the save.

Peyton Hood would get the win on the bump for the Golden Eagles as he extends his record to 4-2 on the season. *Michael Speck* would end game one going 1-for-3 with two runs, two RBIs, two walks, and a homerun. *Hunter Strong* would finish 1-for-2 with three runs, two RBIs, and a walk.
