The Centurions continued their push toward regional and state meets with two invitational meets this past week. On Tuesday, they lined up at North Oldham High School against



Casey Sallade, Sam Sampson, Will Thompson, and Nathaniel Turner. The seniors celebrated Senior Night as six different seniors collected two hits each and five senior pitchers combined to limit Butler to three hits in the 10-2 victory.

CAL scored their first run in the bottom of the first. Michael Lynch grounded a single into right and advanced to third on Jack Perdue's line drive single to center. Lynch scored on Jett Peterson's single to right.

CAL scored twice in the second inning to extend their lead to 3-0. Logan McNair was hit by a pitch to open the inning with Avery Hare entering the game to run for the pitcher McNair. Hare raced to third on errant pick off throw and scored





Casey Sallade walked to lead off the fifth with Andrew Gilliam running for the catcher Sallade. Will Thompson reached base when his sacrifice bunt was mishandled, Gilliam advancing to second base. Michael Lynch was hit by a pitch to load the bases. Jack Perdue singled to score Gilliam with the bases remaining loaded. Jett Peterson hit into a force play before Nick Britton cleared the bases with a double to centerfield giving CAL it's final margin of 10-2.




On Tuesday, CAL hosted 10<sup>th</sup> ranked North Oldham, winning in walk-off fashion, 4-3, in the bottom of the seventh inning.

With the scored tied 3-3, Noah McCarty singled to right to open the inning. Logan McNair pinch ran for McCarty and advanced to second base on an errant pick off throw. McNair then scored when Ryan Lynch's bouncing ground ball went through the first baseman into right field giving CAL the 4-3 victory.



North Oldham opened the game with two runs in the top of the first inning, but CAL quickly tied the match in the bottom half of the frame. Michael Lynch doubled to centerfield and advanced to third base one out later when Jett Peterson reached on an error. Lynch scored on Nick Britton's sacrifice fly to right field with Peterson tagging up and advancing to second. Peterson then stole third base and scored when the throw got away from the third baseman to tie the score at 2-2.



The 2-2 score held until CAL scored their third run in the fifth. Nick Britton, Avery Hare, and Noah McCarty all singled to load the bases. Britton scored one out later on Nat Turner's sacrifice fly, giving CAL a 3-2 lead. North Oldham tied the game in the sixth on a home run setting the stage for the 7<sup>th</sup> inning walk off victory.

Noah McCarty went 3-3 (all singles) to lead CAL in hits while Jacob Price had two singles. Michael Lynch and Jett Peterson both doubled while Nick Britton and Avery Hare singled. Jacob Price went the distance on the mound, using only 78 pitches, allowing five hits and one

walk. At one point, from the 1<sup>st</sup> through early in the fifth inning, Price retired 13 of 15 batters he faced.

On Thursday, CAL faced Male and Jack Perdue pitched a three-hit complete game, but CAL only mustered two hits of their own in losing, 2-0.

Male scored once in the second and once in the fourth to account for the only runs in the game. CAL had only two runners reach third base in the game. Jack Perdue retired 10 of the last 12 batters in the game for the Centurions. For the game, CAL had a double from Noah McCarty and a single by Jett Peterson.

CAL finishes the regular season with a 15-15 record. The Centurions were 3-0 in district play to earn the #1 seed for the district tournament, having shut out all three of their district opponents. The 2022 28<sup>th</sup> District Tournament is being played at Kentucky Country Day (KCD) with CAL having played KCD at 5:00. The winner of that game plays in the district championship game on Friday at 5 p.m. The winner is to play the winner of the Eastern/Ballard game on Wednesday. Christian Academy has previously won the district tournament championship once, that coming in 2007.

The girls team continued in their quest to defend their 2021 state title and swept the sprints (**Taylor Touche**, 100m; **Jenna Doezema** 200m & 400m). **Kayleigh Burkhead** earned a PR and 4<sup>th</sup> place finish in the 400m. **Anne Marie Krebs** took 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 800m and **Brooke Greenwell** was 7<sup>th</sup> in the same race. **Emma Wilkins** was 4<sup>th</sup> in the 1600m followed by **Kaitlyn Bader** who was 5<sup>th</sup>. **Ella Mast** took 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 300m hurdles. In the field events, **Brianna Isa** won the pole vault, **Ella Daniels** was 3<sup>rd</sup> in the high jump, **Maggie Hydes** was 5<sup>th</sup> in the discus, and **Savannah Gardner** was 6<sup>th</sup> in the shot put. The girls topped off the night with a dominant win in the 4x400 relay (**Mast, Burkhead, Krebs, Doezema**) for a season best 4:11.

Saturday brought the Fern Creek Relays which were held at the new Norton Healthcare Sports and Learning Center. Twenty four teams registered for what should have been a large and competitive meet. Weather played a significant role in the day, starting with heat and sunshine, and ending with thunderstorms that cut the meet short. Just as the boys 800m was about to begin a 30-minute lightning delay was instituted and as the delay grew to 2 hours, the delay became a cancelation of the remaining events.
