After a long weekend in Bowling Green at the Border Battle, CAL visited Atherton on Monday to get the week rolling.

CAL jumped out 1-0 in the first inning after a bunt single by Right Fielder Madison Raley,



and a single by Center Fielder Grace Mullins.

CAL added another run in the 4th when Junior Grace Mullins doubled and scored on a single by Senior Karly Fetter. Mullins singled and advanced to third on a two base error in the 6th, and she later scored on a wild pitch making it 3-0 in the 6th.

CAL BASEBALL ALLOWS O RUNS IN SEASON DISTRICT PLAY!!

Jack Perdue tossed a twohitter and Michael Lynch's lead-off home run in the bottom of the first inning was the only earned run in the game in CAL's 5-0 victory over district rival Ballard at home on Tuesday of last week.



The victory gave CAL an undefeated 3-0 record in the 28th District. It appears to be the first time since at least 2000 that Christian Academy has won the season district title. All three wins were shut outs: CAL 7, Eastern 0; CAL 11, Kentucky Country Day (KCD) 0; and now Ballard, 5-0. CAL will now have the #1 seed in the district tournament, which is tentatively scheduled to begin May 16 with CAL playing KCD. KCD will host the tournament.

chose him to captain this year. He will definitely be missed - and we wish him the best and pray for God's blessing on his future.











Against Ballard, CAL scored all five of the game's runs in the bottom of the first inning. Michael Lynch led off the bottom of the

first inning with a home run over the right field fence on a 3-2 count. Lynch's homer proved to be the only earned run of the game. After the home run, Casey Sallade reached first base on a dropped third strike, with Logan McNair entering the game to run for the catcher Sallade. McNair stole second base and advanced to third base on a wild pitch. Nick Britton walked and stole second base. Two outs later, both scored when Jack Perdue lined a single into centerfield. Andrew Gilliam entered the game to run for the pitcher Perdue. Jett Peterson line grounded



a single into left field with Gilliam advancing to second base. Both runners advanced on a wild pitch and then both scored on Jacob Price's singled into centerfield to conclude the scoring for the game.

Meanwhile, Jack Perdue was in command on the mound, allowing only two hits and walking three while striking out nine. Only two Ballard runners reached third base, one in the third inning and one runner in the fifth inning.



CAL had the home run by Michael Lynch and two singles each by Jett Peterson and Jack Perdue. Casey Sallade, Noah McCarty, and Jacob Price also collected singles in the game.

On Thursday, CAL traveled to Southern High School and cranked out 13 hits while three CAL pitchers held Southern to five hits as CAL evened their record at 13-13 with a 7-3 victory.

Southern scored the first run of the game on a first inning sacrifice fly, but CAL took the lead for good with three runs in the second inning. Avery Hare reached on an infield single to open the frame and advanced to second base on a wild pitch. Noah

McCarty bunted for a single with Hare moving to third. A passed ball scored Hare and McCarty scored when Jacob Price lined a triple to right field. Price scored on a wild pitch to give CAL a 3-1 lead.

CAL made it 4-1 in the third inning. Jett Peterson tripled down the right field line with one out and scored on Nick Britton's sacrifice fly.

The Centurions increased their lead to 5-1 in the fourth inning. Jacob Price singled for his second of his three hits of the game to lead off the inning. One out later, Price advanced to third base when Ryan Lynch lined a single to right. Price scored when Michael Lynch grounded a single into left field.






and Jett Peterson tripled. Nick Britton, Jack Perdue, and Ryan Lynch all singled once. Nathaniel Turner was the winning pitcher for CAL going four innings. Logan McNair pitched two innings of hitless relief and Avery Hare pitched the final inning to secure the CAL victory.

On Friday, CAL went on the road to face defending state champion and current 3rd ranked Trinity for the second time this season. In this game, Michael Lynch held Trinity to two hits over 7 2/3 innings before CAL finally fell, 2-1, in 11 innings. Trinity had won the earlier match up, 5-3, scoring only one earned run in that previous match up.

The only run allowed by Lynch came on a home run in the bottom of the third inning, giving Trinity a 1-0 lead. Lynch then retired the next eight batters and 11 of the next 12. Only three other runners advanced as far as second base in the game in 7 2/3 innings pitched.

CAL tied the game in the fourth inning. Jack Perdue walked to open the frame and advanced to second base on a wild pitch. Perdue moved to third on Jett Peterson's ground ball and scored on Nick Britton's sacrifice fly.

CAL had three other runners reach third base during regulation with two runners thrown out at home during the first seven innings of the game. CAL left 10 runners on base during the game and Trinity stranded nine with five of those stranded coming in extra innings. CAL stranded two runners in the four extra frames.

CAL outhit Trinity in the 11-inning game, 7-5. Jack Perdue had two singles for the Centurions and Avery Hare and Ryan Lynch both doubled. Michael Lynch, Nick Britton, and Jett Peterson all singled. Avery Hare made a clutch defensive play with an unassisted double play of a line drive in the ninth inning to end a Trinity late game rally.

Michael Lynch allowed only two hits, walked three and struck out nine in 7 2/3 innings for the Centurions. Will Thompson pitched 2 1/3 innings of relief, striking out four.


