VARSITY SOFTBALL

It was a busy week for the Warriors with three games on the road. On Tuesday CAI faced 2A Crawford County, and despite the Warriors ultimately falling to the Ladypack (18-9) some positive things took place for the Warriors, including a five run 6th inning led by a triple from Brooklyn Shields, Leah Stevens, Loran Palmer and Marissa Sedoris also collected hits for the Warriors. On Thursday the Warriors took on South Central and came out victorious (10-9) in a back and forth game to mark the first victory over the Rebels. Leah Stevens led the Warriors at the plate going 3-4 with a triple, double and three RBIs. Marissa Sedoris (2), Loran Palmer and Brooklyn Shields once again contributed hits for the Warriors. Leah Stevens worked hard in the circle, throwing 136 pitches, striking out 10. In the final matchup of the week, the Warriors travelled to Eastern to face another tough 2A opponent. The Musketeers got out to an early lead and the Warriors couldn't recover, losing 24-1. The bright spot in the line-up came when Leah Stevens hit a line drive that one-hopped the left field fence for a standup double. In the next at bat, Brooklyn Shields hit a ground ball up the middle to score Leah. The Warriors advance to 2-2 for the season.
