From then on, the Centurions rolled over the Eagle defense, gaining 271 yards. Junior Quarterback Cole Hodge led the team with 109 yards (5/5) and 19 rushing yards (1 carry), resulting in 3 passing touchdowns. In addition, CAL Senior running back Gavin Copenhaver led the team with 48 yards and one receiving touchdown.




Sophomore wide receiver Connor Hodge had one catch, resulting in 37 yards and a touchdown. Junior wide receiver Justin Ruffin also had one catch, gaining 17 yards and a touchdown. Sophomore wide receiver Trey Cotton caught one pass for 15 yards and scored a 17-yard rushing touchdown. And freshman

tight end Micah Akin had a 21-yard touchdown catch.



The Centurion's impressive defense shut out the Eagles, holding them to a negative 12 yards of total offense. CAL's defense recorded 31 tackles from 13 players, including seven by senior linebacker Gavin Copenhaver, four by senior McKade Bratcher, and four by senior Sam McCoun. In addition, sophomores Connor Hodge and Vince Possidento each had an interception, with Hodge returning his for a touchdown. The CAL defense also forced some fumbles, with Senior Nate Heidenreich and freshman Chapman Russell each recovering a fumble.

CAL has the weekend off next week as they prepare for the Bowling Green tournament and the 2A state championship.



Immediately following the fumble recovery, Grayson Kline hits Aaron Soete for another CAL touchdown, extra point good. CAL 29. Colonels 0.

CAL's offense come on the field, Killinder runs for 5-yards, Trey Hillerich catches a 15-yard pass and Hayden Durst catches a 70-yard touch-down pass! Aaron Soete runs in the 2-point conversion making the final score CAL 55 – Colonels 6

Extra point no good CAL 6 Colonels 0. Madden Miller (#9) kicks off and the Colonels are stopped at the 50-yard line by a nice open field tackle by Man Robinson (#14). Andrew Green (#19) makes a big sack for loss and Oldham County is forced to punt. Ja'Hyde fields the punt and runs it back 60 yards for a touchdown! Andrew Green catches the 2-point conversion. 
