Media Centers; Full-size Computer Labs for all grades; Wireless Computer Labs; 740-seat Auditorium: Cafeteria.






The ACT consists of curriculum-based tests in English, mathematics, reading and science designed to measure the skills for success in first year college coursework.



AP Exam

Christian Academy offers a wide variety of 19 AP courses. Each year all of our students taking AP classes participate in an AP Exam that compares our students with their peers in the state of Kentucky as well as across the globe.

In 2022, 173 AP students at Christian Academy of Louisville took the exam with 80% or 138 scoring a 3 or higher. In the state of Kentucky, only 52% of AP students who took the exam scored a 3 or higher, and 56% of global AP students attained this score.



25 students were recognized as AP Scholars (passing at least 3 AP exams). 16 students were recognized as AP Scholars with Honors (passing 4 AP exams) and 12 as AP Scholars with Distinction (passing 6 AP exams).

College Attendance

Of the Class of 2022, 98% attend a four-year college and less than 1% attend a two-year college. 61% attend an in-state, public, fouryear college. 25% chose to attend a Christian college.

Academic Distinction

The Class of 2022 had 1 National Merit Finalist and 2 National Merit Commended Scholars. 6 students were appointed as Governor's Scholars and 4 students were accepted to the Governor's School for the Arts. We have also had 8 military academy appointments in the last 8 years.

Academic Support

10% of high school students received academic assistance to support individual learning styles and needs.
