Junior Ella Mast closed out CAL's first half scoring by slipping the ball past the Eastern keeper off a cross from Snowden. CAL carried a 3-1 lead into halftime and never looked

back. Excellent passing and solid defensive play allowed the Centurions to control play. Taylor Touche scored again to start the second half, followed by a second goal by Jasmine Hubbard off a nice assist from junior Elise Michel. Sophomore Addison Chandler rounded out the CAL scoring with a vet another long free kick goal to bring the score to 6-1.





CAL advanced to the District championship to face off against rival Ballard Bruins. CAL and Ballard have met quite often in the district championship, but CAL had not beaten Ballard since 2019. Just three weeks ago the Centurions played the Bruins even but lost a 1-0 heartbreaker. CAL vowed they would be back for revenge in Districts. Thursday night brought that chance and Coach Zutt's squad was more than ready! CAL controlled play throughout the first half and kept the ball on their offensive end putting pressure on the Bruins. Occasional runs by Ballard were turned away by the stalwart defense of junior Luna Guarin, senior co-captain Madison Raley, senior co-

captain Jasmine Hubbard, sophomore Addison Chandler, and freshman Kynlee Cornett in front of junior goalkeeper **Sam Durston**. Although the halftime score was even at 0-0, it was clear that CAL held the advantage and momentum. Yet, they had failed to convert on scoring chances and it remained anyone's game. Ballard came out of halftime with renewed fight, but CAL regained their footing and soon had the ball on their offensive end and under control. It felt like only a matter of time before the Centurions would be on the board. That moment came with 29 minutes left to play when Addison Chandler juked a Ballard defender, made a quick turn and fired it to the far corner of the net well outside the reach of the Bruin goalkeeper. CAL led 1-0 and were on their way to avenging last month's loss! **Taylor Touche** scored the insurance goal on a hustle play to bring the score to 2-0 with 18 minutes to pay. Ballard managed to score several minutes later, but the Centurions locked down and used team play to control the ball and run out the clock for a huge victory over a rival and to win the 28th District Championship!

The Centurions continued to apply pressure on the Rocket defense, and with less than a minute remaining, CAL earned a penalty corner. With only



nine ticks left on the clock, senior Anne Marie Krebs slammed home another goal, making the final score 2-0. This marks another big win for the Centurions against a nationally ranked team.

The Centurions traveled to Goshen, KY, where they faced an experienced and energetic North Oldham field hockey squad. CAL jumped out to an early lead, thanks to two quick goals from Mia Schoenbeck. Later in the half, junior Sophia Coombe netted one from close range, making the score 3-0 in favor of CAL heading into halftime.

In the second half, the Centurions continued to create scoring

opportunities, but the Mustang defenders did a good job of minimizing the damage. Late in the third quarter, junior Callahan Wilson earned CAL's fourth goal of the game, after sweeping in a rebound near the back post. Then, in the middle of the fourth quarter, sophomore Lauren Sloan fired a shot from just inside the circle, zipping the ball past the Mustang goalkeeper. Final score: CAL 5, North Oldham 0.

The CAL Varsity Football team has dominated every opponent this season and hoped to do the same this past Friday night in its annual grudge match against cross-town

rival DeSales. The Colts had been winless all season, including a 49-6 loss to Henry County, who the Centurions defeated by 46 points a week later. Yet CAL coaches and players know not to take rivalry games for granted, so they approached the game with seriousness.

Yet within the first 13 seconds, it was clear CAL would be unmerciful to

their long-time rival when junior Justin Ruffin returned the first kickoff of the game for a touchdown. From then on, CAL never let up, scoring 44 points in the first half and ultimately shutting out the Colts in their 51-0 victory.

Senior quarterback Cole Hodge was 9 of 10 attempts for 239 passing yards. Justin Ruffin gained 118 yards and

two touchdowns on two receptions, sophomore Connor Hodge gained 43 yards and two touchdowns on three receptions, sophomore Trey Cotton gained 59 yards and one touchdown on three receptions, and sophomore Britt Redman had 13 yards and a touchdown on two receptions.





Senior running back Gavin Copenhaver led the team in rushing yards,

gaining 29 yards on four carries, followed by Jaylen McRoberts with 20 yards on two carries and Jeffrey Vazzana with 11 yards on three carries.

The Centurion defense limited the Colts to 31 yards of total offense. The defense recorded 20 total tackles, including three sacks from seniors Gun-

nar McKinley (2) and Braden Robinson (1). The defense also recorded a forced fumble by senior Gavin Copen-

haver that was recovered by junior Alex Ullom and an interception by sophomore Vince Possidento.

Centurions have a bye this week but will return October 21st for their final regular season home game and celebration of Senior Night, as they take on Western Hills at 7:30 pm on Taziki's Field.



Both teams are #1 seeds in the upcoming State Tournament regardless of this game's result. Today it's a home field double header with the JV team playing the first game followed by the varsity. It was a cool 39 degrees at kickoff, football weather!

JV Game

 1^{st} Half – CAL's offense starts the game with Grayson Cline (#4) at quarterback. Ty Binder (#16) runs hard on first down for 12 yards and a first down. Jordan Cook (#5)

1st Quarter – CAL receives the opening kickoff with nice run back by Jayden Leak (#34). On second down, Jackson Burke (#7) hits Man Robinson (#14) with a perfectly timed 65-yard touchdown pass! WOW! Madden Miller (#9) kicks the extra point and it's CAL 7-0. Miller kicks off and Andrew Greene (#19) makes a nice open field tackle. Gabriel Lumpkin (#20) and Andrew Green stop the Mustangs cold forcing a punt. Starting on their 27yard line, CAL's offense goes to work. Burke's pass to Leak picks up 10-

yards. Nolan Perkins (#33) picks up a couple tough yards and Grayden Reid (#3) makes a beautiful catch and run for 30yards. Greene runs for 10, Leak runs for 5yards and then Burke hits Greene for a

goal. From the 8-yard line, Flores runs it in for the touchdown. CAL 27-0. CAL kicks off and on the the Mustang's first play Reid makes a nice tackle for no gain. The defense then forces a fumble recovered by Aaron Soete (#25). On 1st down, Sam Bates makes a circus catch (going high in the air over the defensive back) on a pass from Burke for a 25 -yard gain setting up another 1st and goal. On 2nd down, Burke hits Reid for the touchdown and Perkins runs in the extra point making it 35-0 CAL. The Mustangs received the kickoff and managed to get a first down but had to punt on their second series due to aggressive defensive tackling by Flores, Jordan Cook (#5), Sawyer Killinder (#18), and



Kellan Hall. Deep in Mustang territory it appeared the North Oldham team would score after intercepting a pass and taking the ball to the 5-yard line, however, the defense made a huge stand keeping them out of the end zone and at the half it was CAL leading 35 - 0.



3rd Quarter – CAL kicks off to start the second half with Reid and Greene making a vicious tackle on the return. The CAL defense stymies the Mustangs once again forcing a punt after great tackling by Callan Hahn (#68), Killinder, Lumpkin and Cook. CAL's offense starts with a nice run by Ty Binder (#16) then it's Burke to Bates for a 20-yard completion. Burke then hits Greene for a 23-yard completion followed by a nifty 15-yard touchdown run by Binder. Miller kicks the extra point and it's CAL 42-0. Miller kicks off and puts the Mustangs deep in their own territory. Cook makes a nice tackle followed by Hall deflecting a pass attempt with the Mustangs facing a 4th and 6 to end the quarter. CAL 42-0.

4th quarter – The Mustangs elect to punt and Reid fields the punt and returns it to to the 43 yard line. CAL was unable to gain a first down and North Oldham force a turnover on downs. Soete makes a nice tackle on this defensive stand and on second down the Mustangs fumble and Hayden Durst (#24) recovers. CAL give the Mustangs a steady dose of runs by Sawyer Killinder picking up first down after first down and running out





the clock. Grayson Cline (#4) takes the final snap and takes a knee. Time expires and CAL wins the league championship game 42-0.

Observations – This was total domination by the Centurions football team against an undefeated opponent (a

team that is going to the State tournament as a #1 seed). The offense has several big time play makers who keep making plays. The defense is fast, aggressive and deep. The team is well coached and disciplined with the only significant penalty being "over celebrating" for a teammate's touchdown. The team gets a bye next week and then steps into State Tournament play with a goal of winning a State Championship. Win or lose, this team is so much fun to watch!
