 ing the first three quarters. Early in the final period, the Valkyries struck

first, scoring on a penalty corner, to take a 1-0 lead with just over 10 minutes left to play in the game. Momentum shifted instantly, almost spontaneously, and the Centurions began to take command of the field. A quick goal from Megan Mauzy leveled the score at 1-1. Just minutes later, a string of precise passes through the SHA defense found Allie Kinser on the back post, in perfect position to slot home the go-ahead goal. In the waning minutes, senior Mia Schoenbeck scored again for CAL, capping off an exciting come-from-behind victory to reclaim the region title.


STATE TOURNAMENT - October 20-22


As the overall \#1 seed going into the KHSAA state field hockey tournament, expectations were high for the mighty Centurions. In the first game, CAL faced a very young and inexperienced Butler High school team. From the opening whistle, the Centurions made it clear they would not be stopped. Junior Sophia Coombe scored three goals in the first three minutes of the match, and just like that, CAL was off and running in their quest for another state title. The rest of the game featured a flurry of goals, with CAL ultimately winning by a score of 13-0. Seniors Mia Schoenbeck, Anne Marie Krebs, Kate Ritter, and Addie Clem all enjoyed goals of their own, while juniors Allie Kinser and Callahan Wilson also got in on the scoring action. The final goal was scored by sophomore Madelyn Frazee.


In the state semifinal game, CAL was matched against the very experienced and talented squad from Assumption High School. A warm October evening set the stage for another showdown. The first half was a battle, and Assumption proved to be up to the task, as they grabbed a 1-0 lead just before halftime. The second half belonged to Assumption. The Centurions fought valiantly, but they could not keep pace with the Rockets. In the end, Assumption outlasted the Centurions by a score of 3-0. ## VARSITY FOOHBALL

In 2003, Isaac's mother, Melissa, was six months pregnant with Isaac when Trooper Patrick was tragically shot and killed in the line of duty. Troopers from the Indiana State Police, along with law enforcement officers from Louisville Metro, St. Matthews, Jeffersontown, Kentucky State Police, and the Clark County, Indiana Sheriff's Office, lined the track in honor of Isaac's father and to support Isaac and his teammates. With a giant American flag in the background, the Indiana and Kentucky State Police provided the Color Guard, and helicopters from the Louisville Metro Police, Kentucky
 State Police, and the Clark County Sheriff's Office performed a flyover during the National Anthem. The officers then lined the tunnel to cheer the team as they ran onto the field to face the Wolverines from Western Hills.


The honors continued throughout the game as several senior players were given opportunities to contribute toward CAL's largest point total and win over the Wolverines, 62-0. Seniors Gavin Copenhaver, Jaylen McRoberts, Nate Heidenreich, and Andy Russell each rushed for a touchdown. Senior kicker Jackson Barrickman, who currently leads the state in points scored in points-after-touchdowns (57), scored six points after touchdowns on six tries. And although senior punter Asa Ioos had not kicked a point-after-touchdown in a game, he was granted an opportunity and successfully scored on his first and only point-after-touchdown attempt in high school.

Junior quarterback Cole Hodge threw for 148 yards on six of six passing attempts and rushed for 75 yards and a touchdown on just one carry. Although it was senior night, CAL freshmen Jeffrey Vazzana and Jackson Settle also rushed for touchdowns, with Vazzana contributing the second longest run of the night, rushing 66 yards for a touchdown. Junior Justin Ruffin ran back a punt for a touchdown, and sophomore Connor Hodge received a pass and ran 53 yards for a touchdown. Sophomore kicker Jason Coleman also contributed to CAL's 62 points, kicking a successful point-after-touchdown.

The CAL defense held Western Hills to just 30 yards of total offense, contributing to the Centurion's fifth shutout of the season. Freshman linebacker Chapman Russell led the Centurions in tackles with one solo tackle, and four assisted tackles, including two tackles for a loss of yards. Russell was followed by another freshman linebacker, Jeffrey Vazzana, who had one solo and three assisted tackles. Vazzana also forced and recovered a fumble. Senior Nate Heidenreich also had one solo and three assisted tackles, and senior Gunnar McKinley forced a fumble and sacked the quarterback. Juniors Nate Ehrenborg, Nathan Carlisle, and Patrick Money also recorded sacks.

Next week the Centurions will play their final season game, traveling the short distance down Shelbyville Road to face their Middletown rival, Eastern High School, at 7:30 pm.

October 22, it's playoff Saturday for the undefeated $7^{\text {th }}$ and $8^{\text {th }}$ grade football Centurions. CAL faces off at home against the Raceland Rams from Ashland Kentucky. Win and advance or lose and the season is over; pressure packed situations for these middle school young men!

$\mathbf{1}^{\text {st }}$ Quarter - CAL receives the opening kick off and the offense goes to work. Man Robinson
(\#14) starts the drive with a nice 5-yard run. Jayden Leak (\#34) catches a pass from Jackson Burke (\#7) for 8 -yards and a first down. Andrew Greene (\#19) catches a nice pass and CAL moves the ball deep into Rams territory but a fumble turns it over to the visitors. The RAMS manage a first down but on their next series a quarterback sack followed by a tackle for loss by Kellan Hall (\#58) and a pass breakup by Grayden Reid (\#3) forces a punt. CAL's offense takes over on their 48-yard line. Greene starts the drive with a nice catches for first down. Robinson then runs for 7 yards and the quarter comes to an end with the score $0-0$.
$2^{\text {nd }}$ Quarter - On 2 ${ }^{\text {nd }}$ and 3, Leaks break off a massive run taking the ball down to the 5 -yard line. A horse collar tackle moves the ball half the distance and on $2^{\text {nd }}$ and goal Noah Perkins (\#33) runs in for a touch down. The extra point is no good and CAL leads 6-0. The Rams offense starts their series with a couple of passes but were short gains due to nice open field tackling by Gabriel Lumpkin (\#20) and Man Robinson. Facing a $3^{\text {rd }}$ and 19, the Rams complete a huge 21yard completion with Micah Newsome (\#17) making a touchdown saving tackle. A sack by Nolan Flores (\#32) followed by incomplete passes turns the ball back to CAL. (A great defensive stand)! CAL
 manages a first down their first series and on a $4^{\text {th }}$ and 14 , Leak catches what appeared to be a first down but the mark left them short by inches. The Rams take over on downs but the quarter comes to an end with CAL leading 6-0 in a hard fought first half.

$3{ }^{\text {rd }}$ Quarter - The Rams received the kickoff and start on their 20 -yard line. The Rams offense dominated the time of possession in the $3^{\text {rd }}$ quarter. Despite nice tackles for losses by Jordan McIntire (\#50) and Andrew Greene, the Rams were able to string together 5 consecutive first downs. On their $6^{\text {th }}$ series the CAL defense stiffened. First Leaks and Reid breakup a pass attempt followed by a Jordan Cook (\#5) tackle for loss and Raceland turns the ball over on downs. CAL's offense had not been on the field for a long time and were unable to move the ball and punted on $4^{\text {th }}$ down. The Rams took two plays to run the ball in for a touchdown and the third quarter ended in a 6-6 tie. (continued on next page)
 own territory to start the $4^{\text {th }}$ quarter. Perkins starts the CAL drive with a 10 yard run and a $1^{\text {st }}$ down. On the next series, Leaks runs for another $1^{\text {st }}$ down. Next series Reid runs the ball hard twice for a $1^{\text {st }}$ down. On the next series the Rams intercepted a pass and take possession but a defensive stand punctuated by a Callan Hahn (\#68) tackle for loss gave the ball right back to the Centurions. CAL's offense had a 4 and out. Then Raceland had a 4 and out. On CAL's last possession in regulation, hard runs by Greene and Leak marched the ball down to the 8 yard line. With 11 seconds to go, CAL completes a pass at the $1 / 2$ yard line (although from this vantage point it appeared the ball cross the line) and the game ends in a 6-6 tie. WOW!

Overtime - In overtime, each team gets an offensive possession from the 10yard line. CAL takes the $1^{\text {st }}$ possession and on $2^{\text {nd }}$ and goal, Man Robinson catches a pass from Burke for a touchdown (extra point no good) and CAL leads 12-6. The RAMS now take their possession from the 10 -yard line. Nolan Flores makes a big stop on $2^{\text {nd }}$ down followed by a holding penalty give the RAMS a $3{ }^{\text {rd }}$ and goal from the 26 -yard line.
