






CAL Cross Country Competes at Louisville Classic!

Minutes later, junior Megan Mauzy delivered the knock-out punch, with a perfectly timed tipin after inserting the ball on a penalty corner. Final score: CAL 10, Atherton 0.



CAL vs. Sacred Heart Academy, - September 29, 2022 When CAL and SHA faced-off back in August, during the season-opening Apple Tournament, the Centurions had looked like the more disciplined team, but it was the Valkyries who had come out on top 1-0. But the story line in this September regular season match-up proved to be vastly different.

On a calm, clear fall evening, an ener-

gized CAL field hockey team took the field in front of the largest home crowd of the season to date. From the opening whistle, it was obvious that the Centurions were on a mission. In the first quarter, after winning a penalty corner, senior captain Mia Schoenbeck drove a ball hard into the circle, where sophomore Lauren Sloan was perfectly positioned to tip the ball up and over the sticks of the charging Valkyrie defenders. CAL 1, SHA 0.



Toward the end of the first quarter, the home crowd erupted after what appeared to be another goal from Sloan. Unfortunately, the officials disallowed the goal, because the ball had ricocheted off the foot of a CAL player before crossing the goal line. Although CAL continued to dominate and create more opportunities, the

score remained 1-0 at the end of the first half.



The Valkyries made some adjustments and appeared to be more organized during the third quarter, producing some scoring opportunities of their own. However, the stingy Centurion defense, led by senior captain Kate Ritter and anchored by freshman goalkeeper Morgan Lala, denied any type of attack mounted by the Valkyries. With the score still sitting at 1-0 entering the final period, the game was shaping up to be another CAL-SHA classic nail-biter that would come down to the wire. But instead, the Centurions gave us all a sneak peek at just how dominant they can be, even against a top-ranked opponent.



A few minutes into the fourth quarter, senior captain Anne Marie Krebs found herself with room to maneuver at the top of the Valkyrie scoring circle. With the ball on her weaker left side, Krebs wound up and fired a reverse chip past several defenders and the SHA goalkeeper, extending the lead to 2-0. About two minutes later, CAL won a penalty corner. Mia Schoenbeck received the insert at the top of the circle, where she slammed a ball into traffic that glanced perfectly off the stick of junior Callahan Wilson and into the back of the net. CAL 3, SHA 0. With just five minutes remaining, it was Schoenbeck again, making the most of her opportunities, putting the exclamation point on this game. After dodging a few defenders, Schoenbeck zipped her own reverse chip into the cage, making the final score 4-0.

CAL field hockey is on the road the week of October 3, with away games at North Oldham and Assumption High School. Their next home game is Tuesday October 11, when they host their crosstown rivals, the Eastern Eagles.

The AP 3A Poll's No. 1 ranked Centurions have now finished seven of their eight victories with the running-clock mercy rule in effect after gaining a 36-point lead on their opponents.

Junior quarterback Cole Hodge was 11 of 15 attempts for 182 passing yards and rushed for 83 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore wideout Trey Cotton gained 67 yards on three receptions, junior wideout Justin Ruffin gained 55 yards on two receptions, sophomore Connor Hodge gained 24 yards on two receptions, senior Gunnar McKinley gained 17 yards on two receptions, and senior running back Gavin Copenhaver gained 17 yards and a touchdown on two receptions. Copenhaver was also the team's leading rusher, with 91 yards and a score. Freshman running back Jeffrey Vazzana rushed for 35 yards and two touchdowns.

The Centurion's dominant defense limited the Wildcats to 134 yards, including ten sacks and a safety. Seniors Gavin Copenhaver and Braden Robinson led the team in tackles with six combined solo and assisted tackles each. Seniors Isaac Patrick and Gunnar McKinley followed with five combined solo and assisted tackles each. Senior Nate Heidenreich led the team in tackles for loss, with a combined four solo and assisted tackles for loss.

The Centurions visit long-time rival DeSales this Friday at 7:30 pm at DeSales High School.








1ST & 2ND GRADE FOOTBALL
