CENTURION FOOTBALL REMAINS UNDEFEATED HEADING INTO PLAYOFFS

The CAL Varsity Football team finished their final regular season game the same way they have most every game this year – with the running-clock mercy rule in effect after gaining a 36-point lead on their opponents.



The Centurions traveled down Shelbyville Road to face their Middletown rival and 6A opponent, the Eastern High School Eagles. Although Eastern led briefly 8-7 in the first few minutes of the first quarter, the Centurions gathered themselves and scored five touchdowns in the remainder of the first half to lead 42-8 at halftime.

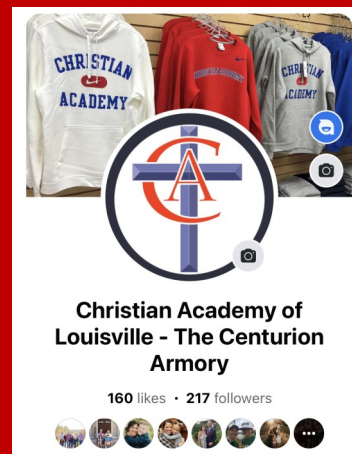

The Girls team finished an impressive 6th in the state amongst 28 teams with 218 points (low score wins). The Lexington Catholic girls took home the state crown with 64 points. The girls team was led by freshman Anabelle Plummer who won a medal for her 14th place effort in a time of 20:28. The state champion Junior Maddie Strong from Scott County completed the race in a time of 18:41. The next CAL runner was senior Emma Wilkins. She finished her high school career in 38th place with a time of 21:39. Sophomore Katherine Kelly finished in 61st place with a time of 22:16. Sophomore Kayleigh Burkhead finished 64th with a time of 22:22. Sophomore Megan Wearsch finished 74th with a time of 22:40. With a strong group of underclassman, the team could be competing for a team state title for the next few years.



The Boys team finished 22nd in a group of 32 teams. They were just 7 points outside the top 20 with a point total of 535. The AA state champion was region rival North Oldham with a point total of 79. The boys team was led once again by Sophomore Samuel Herbig who also won a medal for finishing in 14th place with a time of 17:01. He was well behind state Champion Sophomore Riku Sugie of Nelson County with an impressive time of 15:38. The next CAL runner was senior Joshua Jordan who finished 74th with a time of 18:35. Senior Carson Guilford finished 143rd in a time of 19:45. Joshua and Carson had strong finishes to their CAL careers. Freshman Elijah Nelson had a strong showing finishing 185th with a time of 20:38. Junior Jackson Korfhage finished 191 with a time of 20:48. Senior Nathanael Bryan finished his CAL career strongly with a 194 finish and a



time of 21:01. Sophomore Luke Stephens finished 224th with a time of 22:21.

A CAL touchdown early in the third quarter caused the mercy rule to go into effect, making for another quick second half and Centurion victory with a final score of 56-16.

Junior quarterback Cole Hodge had a huge night, throwing for 200 yards and four touchdowns on six of twelve attempts and rushing for 110 yards and two touchdowns on four carries. Junior wideout Justin Ruffin again led the team in receiving yards, gaining 86 yards and a touchdown on two receptions. Sophomore Connor Hodge, sophomore Trey Cotton, and senior Malachi Embers also had receiving touchdowns.



In addition to quarterback Cole Hodge's 110 yards and two touchdowns rushing, senior Gavin Copenhaver rushed for 64 yards and a touchdown on five carries. Freshman Jeffrey Vazzana also contributed, with 28 yards rushing and a touchdown on four carries.

Defensively, the Centurion defense had 79 tackles, including five sacks and 19 tackles for a loss of yards. Senior linebacker Gavin Copenhaver led the team in tackles with twelve, including four solo tackles, eight assisted tackles, and a forced fumble. Senior McKade Battcher had nine total tackles, including a sack. Senior Sam McCoun had seven total tackles with two sacks. Senior Nate

Heidenreich had four total tackles, senior Braden Robinson had five tackles with a sack, and junior Alex Ulom had five tackles.

The Centurions start their run for a Class 3A 2022 State Championship with their first playoff game this Friday at 7:30 pm at home, facing the Larue County Hawks.
