1. Give two examples of how Native Americans interacted with their physical environment.
2. What is three sisters farming?
3. According to the video, why was Columbus in the Americas?
4. List three New World plants (named in the video) that would go on to become part of European culture and cuisine. Name three plants Europeans brought to the New World.
5. What non-native species, brought to the Americas by Europeans, would go on to be crucial to the lives of Native Americans?
6. What two crops led to a demand for labor, which eventually led to the importation of enslaved Africans?
7. Give an example from the video of the impact new Old World disease had on Native populations.

Period 1: 1490-1607

European Exploration and the Columbian Exchange

Key Concept 1: Before the arrival of Europeans, native populations in North America developed a wide variety of social, political, and economic structures based in part on interactions with the environment and each other.

Key Concept 2: Motivated by economic, political and religious developments in European society, Portuguese and Spanish explorers encountered and then conquered much of the Western Hemisphere during the late 15th century and throughout the 16th century. The clash of cultures that resulted from this European colonization effort and what is known as the Columbian Exchange led to significant changes to the indigenous population of North America.

Period 1 Reading Questions (answer in complete sentences):

1. What were three major reasons Europeans began exploring beyond their shores by the 15th century?
2. By the end of the 16th century what parts of North America did the Spanish control?
3. Explain the methods used by the Spanish to control create New Spain.
4. What was the connection between the Spanish and the Catholic Church?
5. Briefly explain the encomienda system and how New Spain's society developed.
6. In broad generalizations, what were 3 major differences between European and Native American cultures?
7. What was the Columbian Exchange?
8. What were 4 of the biggest impacts of the Columbian Exchange?
