SCHOOL OF BIOMEDICAL SCIENCE

Christian Academy's School of Biomedical Science (SBS) is a renowned and quite rigorous STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) educational experience that instills a distinct, exciting and personal Kingdom-building perspective for students who wish to pursue biomedical science-related fields. Its one-of-a-kind approach to learning combines academics with real-life experiences including both local and developing world medical challenges. Learning opportunities include crime scene scenarios, the investigation and design of emergency rooms of the future, shadowing leading medical physicians, personally working alongside local and international healthcare organizations, and more. Each experience is designed to provide an integrative, hands-on work experience for students as they consider next steps leading to their future in biomedical science career fields.

Based on course offerings, student involvement and proficiency, plus the integration of science within the school, the SBS has been a PLTW School of Distinction for five years in a row. Additionally, and very importantly, students are enthralled with the curriculum. As Delisa Riley, High School Science Department Chair, explains, "Due to the Biomedical Science focus of the program, many students have had a chance to narrow what career path they want to take. Particularly they are drawn to, and fascinated by, the hands-on nature of the classes; their ability to think critically in any situation and the college readiness provided. Former students state, 'Our first year of college was not as difficult for us as we had anticipated'." She adds, "We also have a special Biomedical Science Recognition Ceremony where white coats, pins and cords are awarded each year, a major highlight for the students."

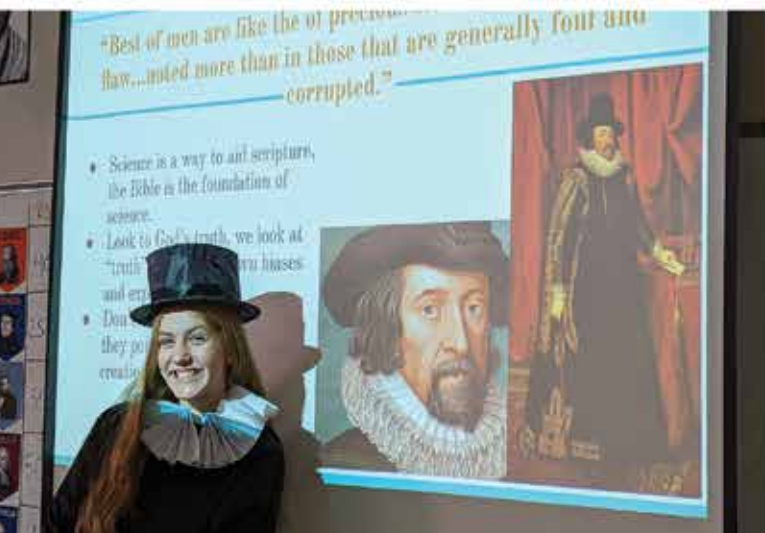


SCHOOL OF SPIRITUAL FORMATION



CAL's School of Spiritual Formation (SSF) is wrapping up its inaugural 2022-23 year this June and our students' devotion to, and passion for, this curriculum has been truly inspirational. The program's organic three-year pathway fully unites with the mission statement of CAL to develop students with hearts for God who grow as Jesus did in wisdom, stature and in favor with God and men. As Kyle Leaman, Director of the School of Spiritual Formation explains, "Every student at Christian Academy has the opportunity to take challenging and formative Bible classes during their time in our high school. However, we noticed there were some students who were hungry for additional opportunities to grow spiritually as it applies to the Bible, and it was this need that the SSF pathway was designed to fill, with four additional Bible courses which are unlike other Bible courses our students take."

The courses' uniqueness? They're limited in size to fifteen students and students have voluntarily applied for them. The classes themselves are less lesson-focused and more open for discussions, habitual spiritual practices such as scripture memorization and devotions, group projects, guest speakers, class activities and even a curated field trip each semester. "Students are also challenged to serve and grow through unique leadership, missions, mentorship and retreat experiences, such as our fall 2022 'Church Traditions' field trip where we visited three local churches. Afterwards we spent time taking students on an enhanced spiritual journey of critical thinking and life application to develop students with strong minds and soft hearts for Kingdom-building purposes," Leaman concludes.



School of the Arts



"The School of the Arts at Christian Academy Schools represents the finest expression of artistic excellence in education I have encountered in any private school in the world," states Christian Thomas Lee, noted concert classical guitarist and fine art collector. And with all due humility, it's no wonder: Since the introduction of musical, performing and visual arts courses at CAL's English Station Campus, the number of students has increased from a handful back in 1995 – with the beginning of a middle school band program – to 500+ participants in 29 captivating course offerings since its inception.

"It never ceases to amaze me of the commitment that the students, directors and staff show to make all of this possible," says Matt Wooten, Director of the School of the Arts. He continues, "with God at the center, this department has grown from 65 students and 1 full time staff in both the middle and high school to 781 students today and 10 full time staff and 2 part time staff for 6th-12th grades. Our School of the Arts students continue to earn multiple offers and large scholarship dollars for colleges and universities across the nation. We have multiple seniors this year who will be attending Christian universities in the fall and some have already earned their entire college career paid for through scholarships and grants. SOLI DEO GLORIA!"

With the school's emphasis on students' development of their God-given artistic gifts and talents, they find themselves in a better position to share God's Word, to demonstrate God's work in their lives and to continue their studies at the college level with advanced preparation. This increased emphasis on college groundwork has resulted in these exemplary statistics - since 1999, approximately 68% of our students who took four years of art have majored in an art field in college and of those students 82% are currently working in an art-related field. In just the past five years, more than 40% of CAL students who participated in our performing arts program have continued to develop and utilize their gifts at the collegiate level through coursework and participation in collegiate marching bands, ensembles and choral opportunities.

And last, but certainly not least, through our growing and award-winning fine arts programs, students have an array of opportunities to develop their gifts; opportunities that are now expanded with the creation of Christian Academy's School of the Arts. Its adept and talented faculty, with their leadership and guidance, provides students with tangible success at local, state, regional and national competitions in both the musical and visual arts.

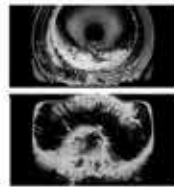

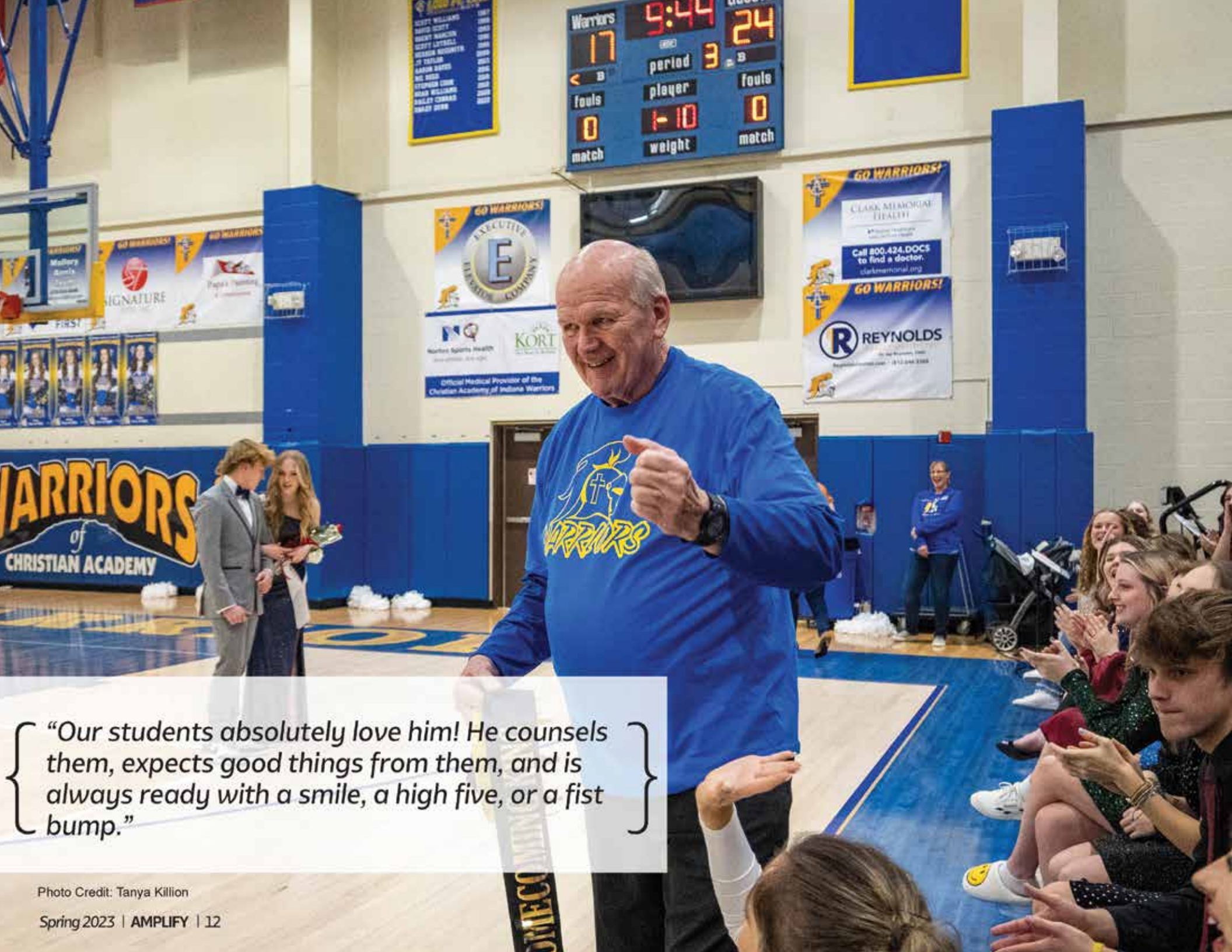

The deadly tornado on December 10, 2021 changed the landscape of Western Kentucky forever. Within hours of the tornado our faculty and staff were planning and hosting a disaster relief drive. We partnered with Crossroads Missions (CM), a Christian organization based in our community of Louisville, Kentucky. One of the arms of CM is called Help Build Hope and their goal is to build relationships while building homes together to help strengthen and build communities. Not only were lives lost and homes destroyed but many felt like they had lost everything. That was until hope arrived in the form of bottled water, clothing, lumber, food and prayers.

The outpouring of support and supplies came from all over the United States. Christian Academy and the greater Louisville community was no exception. Within 24 hours of the tornado we were filling box trucks, flatbed trailers and more. One of the longer term goals we had was to raise enough money to build the house frame for a home with Crossroads Missions and Help Build Hope. Not only did we raise enough money for one house but we raised enough money for three homes. We built the house frame for house number one in April 2022 and just completed house frames two and three in March 2023. What a joy it's been to raise money, physically build these frames, pray for their future families and in some cases meet the new home owners as they've moved in.

One thing that has remained true, our Christian Academy family rises to the occasion when a neighbor is in need. Whether you gave, prayed or helped to build with us, thank you for helping to build hope in Western Kentucky.

There is something so beautiful when people are on mission. Every team member is fully aware of the goal that is set before them to accomplish something greater than themselves. This was the take away I had when I sat across from alumni Josh Kelly along with his fascinating family and heard their amazing story.

I have seen the Kelly family at school, always greeted by their kind, joyful smiles, but had no idea the impact they have in the world and what heroes of the faith they are. What pure joy and inspiration it was to hear about their life and catch a glimpse of the amazing work they do. It was truly a morning I will never forget. I hope you are as spurred in your faith after reading about them to do something extraordinary for Christ as I was when I left their LightUp Toys office on Commerce Drive.

Working at CAI for years I heard stories of an alumni that started a light up toy business that grew so exponentially while he was a student at Christian Academy that he was often found in the bathroom on the phone conducting business with distributors around the world. After meeting with him I learned of a much larger story filled with whimsy, vision and purpose that God gave alumni and entrepreneur Josh Kelly along with his family including his sister Tamar, who is also an alumni, to impact the lives of children and families in need around the world.

When Josh was one year old his family moved to Quito Ecuador to start a mission to help people in need and spread the love and light of Jesus. To support their missionary work they sold handicrafts made by the Ecuadorian people. Josh's mom, Renata, taught the ladies how to make sweaters using colors that would be popular in America during different seasons. Chris and Renata (Josh and Tamar's parents) would travel from house to house in the Andes mountains down into the jungle taking the Ecuadorian handicrafts and sweaters back to the U.S. and sell them at various festivals like Harvest Homecoming. The proceeds provided income for the Ecuadorian people they served.

Some of the handicrafts that their family brought to the festivals were beautiful Ecuadorian tapestries. As a little boy Josh would go to festivals with his Abuelita (Grandma), whom everyone affectionately calls Mamita. Mamita taught Josh how to tell the story of the tapestries. He learned to tell what the designs meant and to share the story of the person that made it. One night, when he was 12, he lit up a park bench at a festival to sell glow necklaces. His success that night showed Josh just how much selling and purchasing something could be an attraction of its own; an experience. At 14, Josh founded LightUpToys.com, now LightUp, and with much tenacity and the Lord's help, he attracted the attention of a major theme park which allowed him to expand his business from festivals to the largest theme parks in the world. Josh's talent in creating stories has benefited him throughout his life while Mamita's training has served Josh throughout his creation of LightUp Toys and their mission.

Since then, LightUp has experienced tremendous growth. Theme parks worldwide are sharing in the success of LightUp patented innovations, like the LightUp Bubble Wand and Bubble Show Retail Carts. They sell toys around the world to entertainment venues such as Disney, Universal Studios and other major theme parks. You can even find LightUp Toys at our local Cracker Barrel.

If all of this isn't cool enough, it gets even better. LightUp Toys is not an ordinary company. It is a company on a mission. LightUp is passionate about improving the lives of disadvantaged children around the world. When Josh, Tamar and the LightUp team sell their toys, they know as a result, not only does that child experience fun and joy but children elsewhere are experiencing love and support. The LightUp mantra is "lighting up the attractions industry to light up the world!"

They certainly stand by their mantra. LightUpToys.com Foundation helps children and families around the world. They currently serve in the United States, Mexico and Uganda. Some of the ways they are making a difference include college and educational programs for those in underprivileged countries, housing for those in need, feeding programs and funding children homes to name a few.

When I asked Josh and Tamar why they are often seen pointing up they said, "it is to point to the true source of our light, we point up to give glory to God." We all have a mission. My prayer after talking with these amazing alumni is that we would "light up" the world and give the glory to God throughout our lives too!
