

We are excited to tell you about a program that we are bringing to CASS, it is called Rachel's Challenge. Rachel Scott was killed during the Columbine School shooting. Rachel's Challenge is a national non-profit that provides K-12 school programs designed to prevent school violence, bullying, and suicide among students. The Rachel's Challenge organization will send a presenter to speak at chapel on January 19. That afternoon they will train 100 students from the English Station and Southwest campuses on how to start a Kindness Club. They say, "We work with the students through the training to equip them with the knowledge and tools to help transform school culture in a positive way through projects and other means through the club they will establish after our visit."
