

## **CAL Football Takes Regional Championship Title & Prepares for State Semifinal!**

Friday night, the CAL Varsity football team advanced to the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Class AAA Football championship playoffs semifinals after defeating the Blue Tornados from Paducah Tilghman High School. In a quarterfinal rematch from last season, the Centurions were determined not to repeat the same mistakes that ended the 2021 season early.



However, the Blue Tornados scored quickly on their opening drive, making for some stressful moments in the first quarter, as it seemed history might be repeating it-



self. CAL got the ball back and quickly drove downfield to the red zone. However, they could not convert the first down and chose to kick a field goal to close the gap and trail 3-7 at the end of the first quarter. Yet Paducah Tilghman responded with their own field goal in the second quarter to lead again by a touchdown. During the final minutes of the first half, CAL responded with back-to-back touchdowns to lead at halftime, 16-10. (continued on next page)

The Centurions returned from halftime to score two more touchdowns and lead the Blue Tornados 30-10. However, it is the playoffs, and Paducah Tilgh-

man responded like a team desperate to keep their season alive, scoring two touchdowns to decrease their deficit to six points with 9 minutes and 11 seconds remaining in the game. The two teams battled back and forth for the remainder of the game, but neither was able to score. Finally, with 1 minute and 42 seconds remaining, the Centurions converted a first down and ended the game by taking a knee, defeating Paducah Tilghman, 30-24.





Senior Gavin Copenhaver led the team in numerous areas, including scoring all four of the Centurions' touchdowns. Junior quarterback Cole Hodge completed 15 of 27 passes for 180 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore Trey Cotton was Hodge's go-to receiver, catching seven passes for 91 yards. Gavin Copenhaver caught three passes for 30 yards and two touchdowns.

Copenhaver also led the team on the ground, rushing for 95 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries. Quarterback Cole Hodge also kept the ball twelve times, rushing for 35 yards.

Gavin Copenhaver led the Centurion defense with 11 of the team's 47 total tackles, including three tackles for loss. Senior Braden Robinson had eight total tackles, with four tackles for loss, and sophomore Connor Hodge had five total tackles with four tackles for loss. Seniors McKade Battcher, Gunnar McKinley, and Nate Heidenreich each had three tackles with one tackle for loss, with Gunnar McKinley recording the only sack of the night.

While others prepare Thanksgiving Day meals this week, the Centurions will prepare to face Ashland Blazer in the state semi-

finals this Friday at 7:30 pm, including a Thanksgiving Day morning practice. A victory for the Centurions Friday night would advance them to the State Championship game on Saturday, December 3<sup>rd,</sup> at Common-wealth Stadium in Lexington. (more photos on next page)
