


### CAL Field Hockey Seniors Selected for National Team

CAL baseball will on the road Monday night at Oldham County and home Tuesday hosting Highlands Latin.







#### CAL JV BASEBALL OPENS SEASON WITH 2 WINS

The Centurions JV team opened the 2023 season against the CEC Cougars, and CAL would score quickly with five runs in the 1<sup>st</sup> inning. Eli Schaaf would start the rally with a single, stolen base, and would score off a double by Nathan King. CAL would eventually load up the bases when Logan York would single to center field to score King and Jackson Watkins. Drew Thurman would score on a fielding error by the 3<sup>rd</sup> baseman. Eli Deming would ground out that would score York for the fifth run of the inning. CAL would continue the scoring heading into the 2<sup>nd</sup> inning with Schaaf double to right field. King would reach on an error, stolen base, and eventually score when Watkins would reach on an error. Thurman would single to center field to drive in Watkins. York would single to center field and both Thurman and York would score on a double to right field by Deming.
