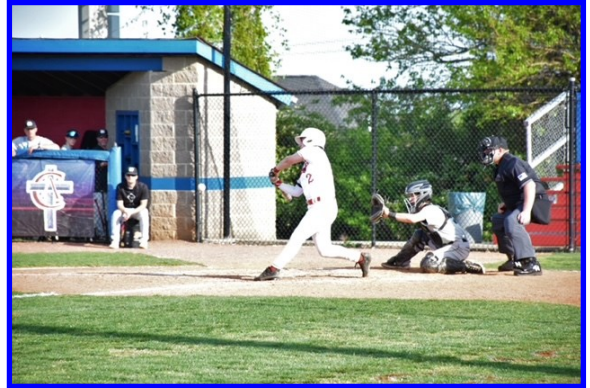

CAL would add to their lead in the bottom of the 2nd inning when Andrew Gilliam and Ryan Lynch would hit back-to-back singles. Tipton would get his second hit of the game as he singles to center field to drive in Gilliam to add to the score, CAL 3-1. The Mustangs would tie the score at three in the top of the third inning. Moving into the bottom of the 7th inning, CAL would be trailing 5-3. McCarty would single to center field, Hare walks, and Bradey Moad would advance the runners to second and third. With two outs, Andrew Gilliam would hammer a single to center field to score McCarty and Hare to tie the score at 5 pushing the game into extra innings. The Mustangs would take the lead 6-5, but the Centurions would not fold. Sam Zeller would reach first after being hit by a pitch, and Tipton would draw a walk to get the inning rolling. Cameron Combs would single to left field to load the bases. McCarty would hit a sacrifice fly to center field as Zeller would tag up and score the tying run to 6. Mustangs would score another run in the top of 9th inning to take the lead 7-6, but the Centurions would push back again. Moad would shoot a line drive sharply to right field and would race around the bases sliding into third base to open the inning. Eli Deming would come in as a courtesy runner, and Deming would tag and score on a sacrifice fly by Eli Schaaf pushing the score 7-7. The Mustangs



would push across another run in the top of the 10th inning, and CAL would try to respond. Combs would reach on an error and King would single to center field. CAL would not be able to score again and would fall short, 8-7. CAL had a season high 15 hits with Tipton, Combs, King, McCarty, and Gilliam having multiple hits in the game. Alex Yarberry took the start on the mound and pitched 6 innings giving up 6 hits, 3 earned runs, 0 walks, and striking out 3. Tipton, Hare, and McCarty would cover the mound for the Centurions final four innings. This was a great high school baseball game for both teams!

The exciting finishes were the theme of the week as CAL would travel to play Male on Tuesday night. CAL would open the first inning with Combs reaching on an error by Male, King would reach on a fielder's choice, and McCarty would single to right field that would put runners on the corner. After a walk by Hare and loading the bases, King would eventually score the first run on a wild pitch giving CAL 1-0 lead. Moving to the top of the 3rd inning, King would hammer a homerun over the left field wall to add to CAL's lead, 2-0. After Male would tie the game at two, Combs would hammer a homerun over the left field wall to push CAL back ahead 3-2 in the 4th inning. In the top of the 6th inning, Moad would reach on an error and Jackson Watkins would enter as a courtesy runner. After Watkins advances to second base by a sacrifice bunt by Gilliam, Zeller would hit a line drive single to left field that would score Watkins to put CAL in the lead 4-2. CAL and Male would find themselves tied at 4 going into the 7th inning, and CAL would give up a score with 2 outs to lose another tough battle on the road. Gilliam took the start on the mound with his best effort this spring pitching 5 innings giving up 2 hits, 2 earned runs and striking out 6. McCarty and Hare would close out the final 2 innings for CAL. (continued on next page)





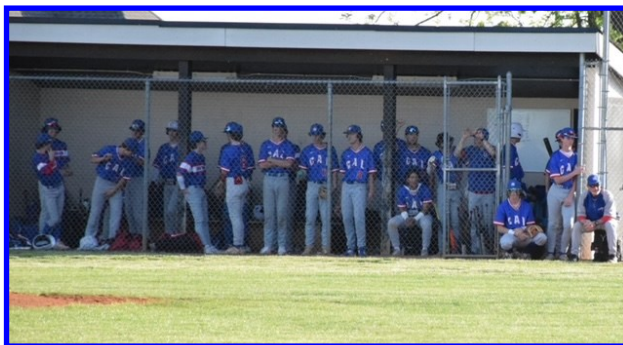
CAL would travel to North Oldham on Thursday to battle the Mustangs under a full moon and the first inning would not disappoint from a scoring perspective. CAL would start a rally on 2-outs when King singles, McCarty walks, and then Hare would double to open the scoring by pushing across King and McCarty. Lynch would draw a walk, and Moad would hit a double to right field to score Hare for CAL's third run. Gilliam would cap off the top of the 1st inning with a 2-run single that would score Lynch and Watkins. The Mustangs would answer where every ball put into play would avoid a Centurion glove.

After a 40-minute first inning, CAL would be trailing 7-5. The

game would calm down over the next couple of innings with no additional scoring. Gilliam would single in the top of the 4th inning and find two Centurions on after Zeller hit by pitch. Tipton would single to left field to score Gilliam. Moad would start the top of the 6th with a single, and Gilliam would reach on a fielder's choice. Tipton drawing a walk would load up the bases again for the Centurions. King would get hit by pitch to push in Watkins for the score, but that is all the runs that CAL would manager in this inning. Hare would open the top of the 7th inning with a double to the left field fence, and Moad would trade places with Hare with a double of his own. CAL would not recover and fall short in this game. Patrick Snider would come into the first inning to get CAL out of trouble and pitch 3 innings giving up 3 hits and 1 earned run. Logan York would pitch the final 3 innings giving up 3 hits, 3 earned runs, and striking out 3.
