VARSITY BASEBALL

The Warriors dropped a hard-fought contest at South Central by a final score of 17-7 on Tuesday, then rounded out the week on Thursday with an 11-9 victory over Cannelton.

The team had a busy week with two, nine hole matches and an eighteen hole tournament.

Their first match last week was a guad match with North Harrison, Trinity Lutheran, and Medora. Landon Stillwell shot an impressive three under and as a team they shot a 147. On Thursday, they traveled to Clarksville and competed against Charlestown, Corydon, and Clarksville. The rain held off for most of the round but soaked the last couple of groups to finish. The CAI came in second, two strokes behind Corydon 173 to 175. The highlight from that match was that Reagan Lanum chipped in on hole 10. On Saturday, they had their first eighteen hole tournament of the season. There were 14 teams and CAI placed eighth with a 372. Landon Stillwell placed third overall with a 76, four over. Keagan Toole made his first birdie of the season on the front nine, and found his second birdie with a 40 foot putt on the back nine. Great to see some improvement on his scoring! Both matches this week will be a good test for the team.
