Milkweed by Jerry Spinelli (ISBN #: 9780375861475) This is the story of a Polish boy during World War II told from the point-of-view of an old man looking back on his life. Unaware of his past, the boy experiences a series of adventures, meeting interesting people along the way. He's a boy who wants to be a Nazi, until the day that suddenly makes him change his mind. When the trains come to empty the Jews from the ghetto, he's a boy, who realizes it's safest of all to be nobody.

The Magician's Nephew by C.S. Lewis (ISBN #: 978-0064471107) On a daring quest to save a life, two friends are hurled into another world, where an evil sorceress seeks to enslave them. But then the lion Aslan's song weaves itself into the fabric of a new land, a land that will be known as Narnia. And in Narnia, all things are possible. The adventure begins in The Magician's Nephew, the first title in C. S. Lewis's classic fantasy series, which has captivated readers of all ages for over sixty years.
