Why?

Because they were not, in that moment, able to persevere. The Israelites crumbled. What enables someone to persevere? I heard a man once say that, "character is built in the midst of adversity," but I don't think that is true. On the contrary, character isn't built adversity, but it is REVEALED by adversity. Here, character of the Israelites showed. At the first sign of adversity in the approaching enemy, (the notion of the Red Sea has yet to be introduced, a notion that would involve great character and great faith) they crumbled.

They crumbled because they could not persevere, and they couldn't persevere because

they had little faith. Faith fuels perseverance.

As parents, we need to know that we cannot teach our children the God given ability to persevere. We can, however, help them along the way by giving our children opportunities to demonstrate perseverance (i.e. letting them fail, showing them defeat, or allowing them to get in over their heads). Ultimately, the ability to persevere is fueled by faith that comes from the Lord.

Parents, we have droves of young men and women faltering in their faith because they lack perseverance, and they lack perseverance because their faith is weak. I implore you to train your children in the faith. The faith that is built upon the inerrant word of God, God's good and

Perfect Being, man's turn from God and His goodness, God's holy wrath, and God's relentless mercy through His Son Jesus.

Teach them the "full console of God" as Paul preached, and then stand back and watch as they rely on God's word when they stand before the sea of tranquility with Satan's army gaining from behind. Know that they stand ready, persevering until that day of glory.
